Congratulations to our September winner, Babbette Harmon!


October Refreshments:

Bernice will coordinate with everyone to plan to get a group picture of the quilts.

Membership Booklet At last month's meeting, Anita presented before the group the idea of making a membership book for all members. This booklet will be available only to our members and will have names, address, birthdays, etc. along with a photograph of each member. This will help for each of us to be able to identify who is who and will be especially good for new members.

The guild voted on this and we will begin work on this at the October meeting. We will look at adding a copy of the bylaws and other important information. If you feel any other information needs to be in the book, please let Anita know.

Educational Corner - Since we are all starting to work on quilts for our next show, it seems to be a good time to share some information that was on display at the NQA show in Little Rock this year. This is a list of great tips to keep in mind when you are getting your piecing your quilts. This information will definitely help make sure your quilt meets the qualifications set by judges. Don't let these tips scare you away – the judge's comments alone are worth having your quilts entered! Have fun! Isn't that what we all wanted when we started this quilting madness?

PIECING

- 1. Intersections, corners & points should meet exactly.
- 2. Curves should be smoothly rounded.
- 3. Thread should not be visible in seams.
- 4. Individual blocks should lie flat and be square.
- 5. Thread color should blend with fabric colors.
- 6. Seam allowances should be trimmed where necessary to prevent shadows.
- 7. Stitches should be strong, close and tight.
- 8. Like pieces should be identical in size and shape.
- 9. Seam allowances should be pressed consistently.
- 10. Loose threads and frays should be trimmed.

Next month's information will have tips on Edge Finishing. Follow these steps and you will be happy with your beautiful quilts whether you plan to enter them in a show, give them as a gift or display them in your home and just admire your own talent!

Lick Skillet Recipe Corner

Skillet 30-Minute Kale, White Bean and Sausage Soup

2 Tbsp olive oil

½ cup chopped shallots (about 1 large shallot)

1 jalapeno, seeded and finely chopped (2 Tbsp)

or (1 tsp) dried red chile flakes (optional)

1 sprig fresh thyme

2 medium cloves garlic, minced (about 2 tsp)

1 tsp dried oregano

1 tsp dried basil

½ pound chicken, turkey or pork Italian sausage, removed from casing

2 cups homemade or store-bought low sodium chicken broth

½ bunch kale, stems removed and leaves cut into ribbons (about 4 cups)

1 15-oz can white beans, drained and rinsed

1 Tbsp freshly squeezed juice from 1 lime or lemon

Fresh picked parsley leaves, for garnish

Heat oil in a 12-inch skillet over medium-high heat until shimmering. Add shallots, jalapeno (if using), and a pinch of salt and cook, stirring frequently, until softened, 2 to 3 minutes. Add thyme, garlic, and dried herbs and cook, stirring constantly, until fragrant, about 30 seconds. Add sausage, breaking it up with a wooden spoon until it loses its pink color, about 4 minutes. Add broth, kale, and beans. Increase heat to bring to a simmer. Fold in kale until it starts to wilt. Using a potato masher, smash some of the beans to thicken the broth. Cover and cook until thickened, 6 to 8 minutes longer. Remove thyme stems and discard. Stir in lime or lemon juice, season to taste with salt and pepper, ladle into bowls, sprinkle with parsley, and serve.

Quilt Show Update - We had a quilt show committee meeting the end of September and have begun moving forward in several of the areas. It is very important that everyone get signed up for a committee because the earlier each committee starts working together, the easier it will be throughout the months prior to the show and things won't sneak up on us!

Some of the main notes from the meeting were:

- Budget for each committee for the show will be due by the January meeting.
- The Hoffman Challenge traveling quilt display has been reserved for our show.
- The quilt show challenge quilt theme has been selected. Our theme will be "Idioms and Catch Phrases." These will be randomly assigned to those who request a phrase and want to make a quilt for this category. The rules, size requirements, etc. will be discussed at this month's meeting.
- Quilts entry rules and forms have been drafted and will soon be finalized and available in November at the meeting and on our website.
- Publicity will be kicking in to full action very soon. Be making notes of any areas you know of where additional publicity can be directed, i.e., newspapers, businesses, quilt shops, quilt shows, etc.

Carolyn will provide additional information at the meeting!


