From the Pastor's Desk.

Greetings in the Name of the Risen Christ!

When I, as Pastor, am assigned to a new church, I try to assess where most of the congregation is theologically, spiritually, and emotionally. This is normally done with Bible studies, prayer groups, and conversations. Sometimes, assumptions are made as to what the congregation has been learning in the years before arrival of the new pastor. Through my years as a disciple, in a number of Bible studies beginning before I even attended theological school, one frequent assignment was to re-write the Lord's Prayer in your own, contemporary language. One goal of the assignment was to help one get away from repeating the Lord's Prayer in rote and assisting a person to really think about what we are praying as we say The Lord's Prayer. I first experienced rewriting the Lord's Pray this way approximately thirty (30) years ago. It is not something new for me. Unfortunately, I made the assumption that most of you would be familiar with hearing the Lord's Prayer in contemporary language as well. Since Easter and the fifty (50) days that follow are a time of newness and growth as Christians, I thought using the Lord's Prayer in contemporary language might help us to stop and think about what we often say mindlessly as we pray together.

Two thousand years (2000) after Jesus death and resurrection, we tend to become complacent about Easter. We certainly do not experience the events as the early Disciples did: confusion, a longing for what was, sadness, loss of hope. I thought using the Lord's Prayer in contemporary language would help some of us to experience a few of the same feelings the early disciples felt.

From hearing the murmurings among the congregation, I believe that using the contemporary language for the Lord's Prayer has done both: caused some to reflect on the words and meaning (those have mostly been positive comments) and has caused others confusion, sadness, and a longing for the way it has normally been shared. I apologize for not informing the congregation ahead of time that we would be praying the Lord's Prayer in contemporary language during the Easter Season which ends with the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (June 9th, this year). If it has caused you to reflect on what we say when we pray, I am thankful. If it has caused you confusion, sadness, or other, perhaps you might have a deeper understanding of how the first disciples felt.

While I apologize for not informing the congregation ahead of time, I am not sorry that I have included the contemporary language of the prayer in worship. My role as Pastor is to assist the members to grow as disciples. I believe the use of the updated versions has caused some growth. For that I am grateful. What I have also learned from this experience is that many folks share their murmurings with one another but do not share them directly with the one who has caused the upset and/or has the position to resolve or bring clarity and understanding to the issue. That makes me sad. I am your Pastor. I believe that I have a good listening ear and an understanding heart. If there is an issue, please speak with me directly. I want to know if you are upset. Many times a situation can be resolved by listening to one another and getting a better understanding of what one another thinks or believes. If you tell one another, but never tell me about something that you like or that is upsetting, there cannot be understanding and growth for either of us. Have something on your mind? Call me, I would love to have a cup of coffee and share our thoughts. Shalom.

Living Holy Week as it was chronicled in the scriptures was a brand new experience.

Opportunities for growth through fellowship have begun. The Women's Retreat brought us together, to explore ways to enhance spirituality and our sense of the Holy Spirit within. The experience strengthened our relationships with one another and left us wanting more. Look out men, your turn is coming!

I have changed. We are changing in many positive ways. As we approach the anniversary of Pastor Pat's arrival (July 1, 2018), let's take a few minutes to reflect on the many ways it which our hearts and spirits have been lifted. And know, this is just the beginning.

<u>June 9th Pentecost Sunday- Invite</u> <u>you to Wear Red</u>

Pentecost marks the end of the Easter Season in the church calendar. It is marked by the arrival of the Holy Spirit as described in Acts 2 and celebrated as the birth of the church. Pentecost is symbolized by wind, flames, and the breath of God as a dove. I invite you to wear red (the flame) as we mark this joyful day in our church calendar. The Holy Spirit is the third nature of the Trinity: Creator, Son, and Holy Spirit. We will conclude our Sunday school year on the same day. Scholarships will be awarded to college students who have applied and met criteria. Following worship we will have a cookout. Please come and join us. (They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. All the believers were together Acts 2: 42-44a) Our celebration will not be the same without you!

<u>3 Week Bible Study on Forgiveness</u>

The Bible Study is offered twice - on Wednesday mornings from 10:30-noon and Wednesday evenings 6:30-8:00 pm.

Beginning May 29th a Bible study on forgiveness will be held. Forgiveness is a core Christian value, but so hard to achieve. It is one of those issues that comes up constantly in our lives and in many situations. We do not outgrow it. We will watch a documentary The Power of Forgiveness in the first two classes: watching half the documentary followed by discussion. In the third class, we will have a short lecture by Gregory Jones (Dean of Duke University Divinity School. He was previously the executive vice president and provost of Baylor University. In addition, he serves as senior fellow for Leadership Education at Duke Divinity, and senior fellow at the Fuqua-Coach K Center on Leadership and Ethics) followed by conversation.. I hope that you will make an effort to join in the class. You can just listen; but being present will say to one another you believe this issue matters to yourself and the church community. No preparation or enrollment is needed and there is no homework.
