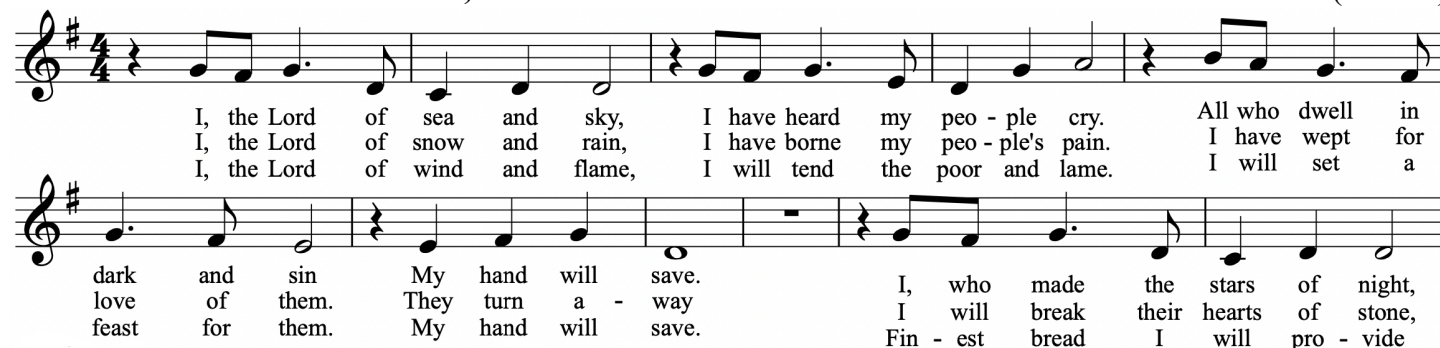


\*It is our custom here at Immaculate Conception to remain standing if you are able until the last person has received communion. There will then be time to sit or kneel in private prayer.


