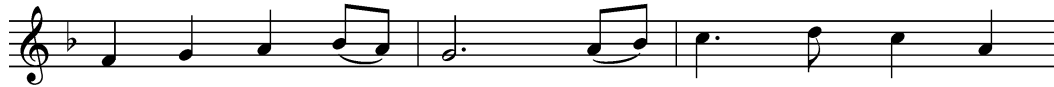

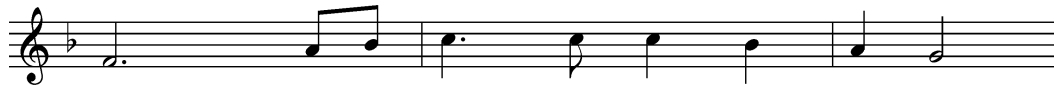

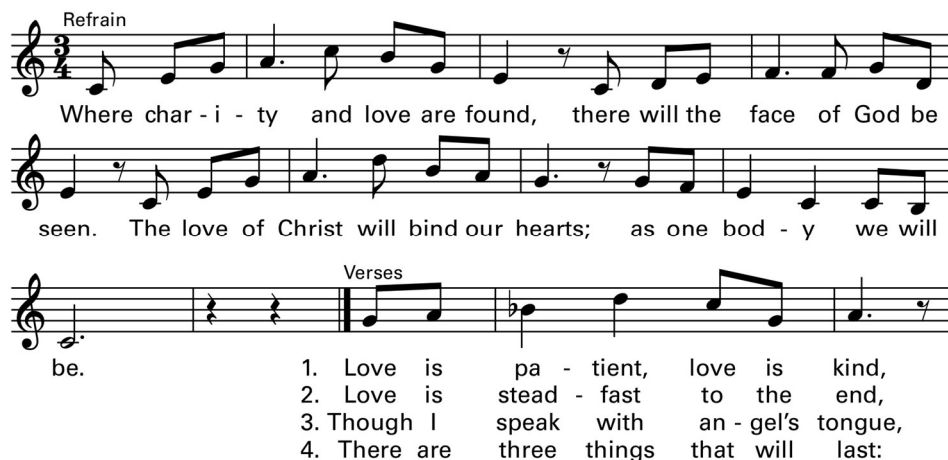
A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE 4:21-30




