Road Test Bonneville 883

Vancouver Island to Naniamo 244 klms return



While we were away on our 5 week adventure to USA, Canada and Alaska, Amanda and I hired a Triumph 863cc Bonneville to travel to meet a workmate of hers who was on a working holiday. The hirers were a very friendly bunch who was pretty laid back. They were very impressed with my rides, which were safely tucked away at home with Indians being very scarce in their part of the world.

We had arrived in the city of Victoria, Vancouver Island and had arranged to meet Amanda's friend, Charmaine somewhere north the next day and after a few fb messages back and forth. It was decided to meet at Jacks Park on the Trans Canadian Highway, Naniamo which was about 120 odd kilometres away. Having checked out the vehicles available we chose the Triumph over a Suzuki Boulevarde, a KTM, BMW, and Harley Sportster.

With Amanda by my side we got to the shop early with our state of origin beanies (to be used as a safety barrier between our heads and nits of the past users of the helmets supplied), our jackets that were meant to keep out the snow and a camera to record the event. No back rest on the bike so it was a little more cosier than sitting on the back of the VTX or Indian.

So on with the Road Test.

First of all can I say the locals do not adhere to the speed limits and mostly travel at speeds well in excess of 20klm over at all times so getting to ride a bike in mountainous country with great roads was going to be a dream come true. The bike itself travelled really smoothly and cornered like it was in rails so it wasn't long before I was confident in what it was going to do at any given time. A little on the skinny side with seats to

match, and foot pegs that were under my body instead if allowing me to stretch my legs fully to the front. The one thing that got in my craw was every time we stopped and I put the side stand up or down. I constantly ran my shin along the left foot peg which was making stopping rather frustrating and sometimes painful.

Amanda on the other hand was having a ball. Wobbling back and forth taking photos on the fly.

As you know the mad buggers drive and ride on the wrong side of the road so it is very disconcerting to see all vehicles ranging from bikes to semi's belting down towards you on your left hand side, and dodging the sawdust flying from the rear of the log trucks (having no visor didn't help). This is especially when you are so vulnerable on a skinny baby motorcycle.



Anyway we entrusted our route to our new TomTom and it did a marvellous until the last couple of klms entering Naniamo where it decided our destination was the ferry terminal. After rechecking our route inputs and getting the same result, Amanda cohersed me to ask the only worker in the terminal for help and we found we were about 100 metres away from our destination but unfortunately the 100 metres was across the other side of the Trans Canadian Highway. Simple she said. " Just go out of the exit and travel about 800 metres and then do a right hand turn to get back on track. Ha Ha , great joke When we got down to where we needed to turn off it was blocked with a solid barrier. Nothing left to do but continue backwards until we find an exit. Easier said than done. After 10 more klms we found an exit and headed for the nearest garage for directions. After gaining some much needed advice from a local who the absolutely great beach at Jacks Park, we headed off down the highway again until Amanda tells me we need another direction boost. So back into another garage to find we had been going in the wrong direction again even if it was at the "locals!" advice.



Right this time we actually went the right way and arrived at Jacks Park to find this supposedly pristine beach was nothing but a mud flat. At least Amanda's friend, Charmaine was waiting for us.



We then and only then had our lunch at about 1pm instead of the 10.30am morning tea which was the first plan.

All in all I loved the ride the bike gave us. The seat was a little hard for my soft butt (felt like we were sitting on a wooden park bench) the fuel consumption was amazingly good but the ride was very enjoyable for both of us. The main problem was that I was afraid Amanda would go to sleep and drop off the back as there was no back rest.

Dear Branches

We've talked before about how to **attract new members** and we know it's not always easy, so here are some suggestions for you to consider in your Branch Committee meetings:

- Be sensitive to a new members needs and availability. Potential members (39 or 40) often have young children which is a change from a 39 or 40 year old of 30 years ago (back in the old days we remember so well...).
- Have a wine and cheese night and ask each member invite 2 people and give a small informal talk about what your Branch does that may entice a new member.
- Have lunches / rides outside of normal meetings / rides and invite friends and co-workers.
- Invite women in pairs to events they may feel less pressure than when by themselves.
- Be conscious of people you meet in your everyday activities they may be potential members.
- Do ice-breaker activities, and hold social events for new members
- Actively Welcome people at meetings. We often hear that a new member went to a Branch meeting but didn't feel welcome – how sad! Give the Branch Extrovert a job to do. We all have a Branch Extrovert who loves talking about the latest ride, where's the best coffee stop etc; harness that energy towards new members.
- Belonging to the club would be far more attractive for a new or potential new member if the fun factor, cohesiveness and respectfulness are portrayed.
- "Old member" ask an old member to give a five-minute personal talk about his club experiences so a new person can learn what seasoned members are all about!
- Feature a Bio and picture of the new member in your Branch newsletter or on your Branch website

We are often our own worst enemies and aren't inclusive towards new members – think about what it was like when you first walked into the meeting.

We've talked about it before...

We will have the Members Guidebook finished soon (yes, it's been a time consuming update) and all Branches will be sent a copy.

The Heavy Stuff

It is timely to remind Branches that we are **one club** and the Branches are a mechanism for members to come together, and not a mechanism for a power struggle. DV RIDE BEEFY'S TO BROTHERS BY DAFFY

This ride started on Saturday when Ryan and I went down to the ferry at Moggill to make sure everything would be ok for Sunday. We were advised there was a push bike event happening and there would be 1000 crazy bikes out there wanting to come across the ferry at the same time. I threw a comment to the ferry crew that we were paying customers so no drama expected.

I had Ryan Hoggett and Tim Lawson ride up the coast on Saturday afternoon and we travelled the intended route in the other direction to get a feel for the road ready for Sunday. We stayed at Caloundra and went for tea at 1 of the local pubs, and had an early night. We were greeted with a lovely morning on Sunday and left to ride to Beefy's about 7.00.

On arrival at beefy's there was 1 person already there waiting for the ride. We had a great pie for breakfast and I set Tim and Ryan the task of registering all of the riders and collecting the money. We ended up with 29 on our ride. I conducted a short ride prestart and we were all ready to go right on 8.30. I had Tim in the middle of the pack and Ryan once again performed the role of tail end Charlie.

We headed off towards Caboolture on the Highway and it wasn't long before we had the first breakdown by a Harley. His speedo cable came out (was probably struggling to keep up with us doing the speed limit). Ryan pulled over and waited and it wasn't long before he was mobile again.

Our first major turn was at the airport on to the D'Aguilar Highway, corner markers were doing their job and everyone turned at the right spot. I kept the speed down waiting for Ryan to catch up to the rest of us and we then turned left at Wamuran to ride up to Mt Mee. The headsets Tim, Ryan and I have were great as I knew we were all together before the climb. This is a great twisty road all the way to the top and well worth the ride, especially as we had done it in the opposite direction the afternoon before.

AT the top of Mt Mee we turned left again and proceed slowly across the top and then down to Dayboro. I had lost contact with Ryan at the back of the pack but could talk to Tim in the middle and he could talk to Ryan. The traffic in Dayboro was a bit thick and we spread out on the ride to Samford. Tim over took me on this leg as he was going to pick up his girlfriend and join back up with us on the other side of Samford. I had been hoping to pick up a bit of time on this leg however the riders were so slow (I was doing 60kph in the 100 zone) and it wasn't until the other side of Samford before tail end caught up.



We picked up Tim on Settlement Road (He was waiting for us) and then proceed round the back of Mt Coot-tha and into Brookfield Rd, Moggill Rd, and on to the ferry. As we were approaching the ferry we were met by a Policeman on a motorbike directing all of the pushbike riders off to the side of the road. They were parked up 4 and 5 wide waiting for their turn to cross the river. We pulled up just as the ferry was leaving our side so had a small delay before we could cross. Sure enough us paying passengers were loaded on the ferry quick smart and they only allowed 30 pushbikes on our ferry as there were only 60 life jackets. The pushbikes were not very happy as some of them had been waiting to cross for over an hour. We then made a quick ride to Brothers via the Cunningham Highway. We might have been a little late however we all arrived at Brothers as 1 group this time.
