

Cleanse the sores which eat away the integrity and health of your people. We need your healing touch, Jesus, personally and as a people.

ENTRANCE HYMN (Luke 4:27; Psalm 41:5)

Priest: There were many lepers in Israel during the time of Elisha the prophet; yet not one of them was cleansed, but only Naaman the Syrian.

All: Once I prayed, "Lord, have mercy on me; heal me, I have sinned against you.

Priest: Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

All: As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

FIRST READING: Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46

GRADUAL (Sirach 38:9-11)

Priest: My son, when you are ill, delay not, but pray to God, Who will heal you. Flee wickedness; let your hands be just, cleanse your heart of every sin.

All: Offer your sweet-smelling oblation and memorial, a reach offering according to your means.

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 10:31—11:1

TRACT (Matthew 8:2)

Priest: Then a leper approached, did Him homage and said,

All: Lord, if You wish, You can make me clean.

GOSPEL: Mark 1:40-45

Priest: A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark

All: Glory be to You, Lord!

A leper came to Jesus and kneeling down begged him and said, "If you wish, you can make me clean." Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, touched him, and said to him, "I do will it. Be made clean." The leprosy left him immediately, and he was made clean. Then, warning the him sternly, he dismissed him at once.

He said to him, "See that you tell no one anything, but go, show yourself to the priest and offer for your cleansing what Moses prescribed; that will

be proof for them."

The man went away and began to publicize the whole matter. He spread the report abroad so that it was impossible for Jesus to enter a town openly. He remained outside in deserted places, and people kept coming to him from everywhere.

Priest: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise be to You, Lord Jesus Christ.

- 1. How does Jesus welcome, heal and reinstate the leper? Try to observe carefully each detail.
- 2. How can we, today, imitate Jesus' attitude towards those excluded?




O Wounded Healer we kneel before you. Reach out and touch us. Heal our leprous wounds.
