The Battle of Baton Rouge 1779 October 5th & 6th , 10 AM until 4 PM Audubon State Historic Site

Step into Louisiana's major battle of the American Revolution. Living History volunteers and groups are needed. Military groups may include Spanish, English, Hessian, Native American, as well as colonial militia. Civilian roles are also needed with period crafts especially welcomed.

Activities will include but are not limited to: musket and cannon demonstrations, drills, quartermaster, blacksmithing, open hearth cooking, clothing talks, medicine, a special display on the wreck of the ship "El Constante Nuevo", and much, much more.

We provide hay, water, rations, and one meal, along with camping on the grounds of Oakley Plantation started by a veteran of the Battle of Baton Rouge. Preregistration is required. Louisiana State Parks Black Powder rules and regulations will be in effect and provided upon request.

Audubon State Historic Site is a Louisiana park located in the town of St. Francisville, 30 minutes North of Baton Rouge, La.
