Rules to Allow Burning of Leaves

From the Duenweg Volunteer Fire Department

Before you BURN...FIRST...CALL 623-7408

*Wind speed not to exceed 10mph

*Must stay with the fire until fire is completely out

*Fire must be extinguished by dark

*Must have water source nearby

*Must have a rake and/or shovel nearby

*No burning anything but wood or yard debris

When calling the DVFD you must give them your name, phone number and a good address of location of intended burning. The DVFD can't be dispatched without calling prior to burning.

NOTE: Any damage due to the burning of leaves and other debris is the responsibility of the person burning. Be smart, call first! **In Case of Emergency, Call 911!**

Please Don't Put Signs In the Round-A-Bout...

The State of Missouri prohibits the posting of signs on the right-of-way near state highways. Here in our City, we also ask that you don't place signs on the right-of-way and that you always get permission from property owners before posting signs.

A Note about Flushable Wipes...

While these items are convenient to use and seem to be easy to dispose of, the truth of the matter is that they are a serious problem. They are not biodegradable and do not break down in the sewage processing system. In fact, we have had to pull the pumps at our lift stations to have these removed as they clog the pump and stop it from working.

Please avoid the use of these products.



Always check to see if you need a license or permit....

It's always a good idea to check with the City to see if you need a permit for home repairs and additions. You can have your contractor obtain the permit, but ultimately, it is the homeowner's responsibility to make sure that a permit is obtained *before* work begins. Our offices are open every day Monday – Friday and you are always welcome to call and check with us. Why are permits required? A permit verifies that the intended building meets our building codes and will be safe for you and any future home owners. Inspections are performed after the work is completed to ensure current codes have been met.
