Report on the Third International Conference on Papuan Linguistics

The 1992 annual conference of the Linguistic Society of Papua New Guinea was held in conjunction with Third International Conference on Papuan Linguistics at Divine Word Institute, Madang on 15-18 September 1992. Approximately 20 papers were presented, and over 40 participants attended. The papers included discussions on phonology, syntax, and lexicography. Several papers were of a comparative perspective. While most papers discussed Papuan languages, several papers were presented on Tok Pisin.

Numerous members remarked about the outstanding quality of the conference. Both the host, Divine Word Institute, and the conference organizing committee, especially John Clifton, Carl Whitehead, John Roberts and Malcolm Ross, earned the appreciation of the participants.

As part of the conference, the Annual General Meeting of the Linguistic Society of Papua New Guinea was held as well. The new officers of the Society for 1993 (and the institutions they are affiliated with) are:

President's Report:

The outgoing president, Sakarepe Kamene, surveyed the general interests of the society over the years. He noted that there is a trend away from 'simple' descriptive studies of single languages toward comparative and pragmatic studies.

The president reported on the progress of the work on the resolution passed by the Society last year. That resolution asked the Executive to try to establish an award for the best linguistic student at UPNG. The president has been working with the UPNG administration to establish an award. The UPNG administration is favourable to such an award system. Mr. Kamene hopes to see an award system in place within the year.

The president reported that all normal activities of the Society (e.g., Publications, meetings, papers, etc.) are continuing well.
