1st/2nd: I hope everyone had a great weekend. This week first grade will be working on the short e sound spelled with "ea" and the bossy r. We will also be working on using prepositional phrases to add detail to our writing. Second grade will be working with silent H and silent C. We will also be working on synonyms and antonyms this week. First grade will be finishing their science unit on tools and technology with a test on Friday. Both classes will have a math test on Tuesday and a spelling test on Friday. Have a great week! - Mrs. Hird

3rd/4th: With a full 5-day week this week, our class will be busy continuing to work on items as we start to wrap up the end of the year. Third grade will have a math test on Wednesday. Fourth grade will continue to work on Order of Operation math problems. We will have Star Testing on Tuesday. In Spelling, we will go back to our normal 5-day schedule with a pretest on Wednesday and a regular test on Friday. If your child hasn't mastered their multiplication facts, they will still be required to continue to work on them until mastered. Knowing these are vital to their future success. – **Mrs. Cooper**

5th/6th: All boards and costumes were due today for the Famous Person Wax Museum! Students are excited to present on Wed. and I appreciate everyone's help in getting the materials together. In Science, 5th grade will be finishing Ch. 17 and will test next week. Students will also start on their solar system models. 6th graders will test over Ch. 1 tomorrow. In English, both grades will be looking at analogies. In Reading, students will present roles over Ch. 74-81 today and will continue reading through Ch. 112. In Social Studies, 5th grade will be getting ready to test over Ch. 4 and 6th grade will continue reading Ch. 5. **7/8 Comm. Arts:** Students will finish their Lit. Circle over "War Horse" this week and will get ready to compare the book to the movie next week. Students will also continue working on their WW I posters.

5/6 Math: In fifth grade, students are looking at operations with simplifying decimals, part/whole relationship story problems, and symmetry. Sixth grade is learning about compound interest, diagraming part/whole relationships, and geometric concepts, including strategies for estimating area and cylinder volume. 7th/8th: In math, seventh grade is looking at scientific notation operations, sphere volume, and linear graphing. Pre-algebra students are drilling with more complex area, applying the Pythagorean theorem, and demonstrating their skill at transformations. In algebra, we are looking at story problems related to systems of equations, writing those, equations algebraically, and the multiplication/division of rational expressions. Science boards for 7th and 8th are due Weds. Tests This Week: 7th/8th SS: Weds.

HELP STUDENTS GET OVER MATH ANXIETY:

Point out that boys and girls can do equally well in math. **Be positive.** Students who think they can do well in math usually do.
