WHY IS THERE A DRESS CODE?

The dress code helps a dancer focus during class by:

- 1. Proper dancewear enables the teacher to see the dancers' positions and movements in order to give necessary corrections for the benefit of the dancer
- 2. Understanding they are going to a structured class (compared to an unstructured playtime, gym time, social setting, etc.)
- 3. A dress code also teaches discipline
- 4. Hair being secure and pulled back in a bun or up in a ponytail helps prevent fidget habits and reduces distraction

SDS offers affordable dancewear in addition to the many retailers. We recommend dancers and/or parents set aside specific shorts, leggings, tanks, leotards, etc. for dance class only.

Dancers are required to wear the appropriate attire for each class as outlined below.

- Students should arrive dressed (including hair) and ready to dance 5 minutes before their scheduled class time.
- Please pack extra hair elastics and/or bobby pins in your dance bag.
- No T-Shirts
- Cover Ups may be worn during the colder months for warm up only
- If dancers have ballet and another style on the same day, they should wear their leotard and tights. Shorts can be worn over the leotard but no changing outfits.



HIP HOP

- Tank Top, Sports Bra, Dance Shorts or Leggings
- Clean sneakers or tan jazz shoes
- Bun or ponytail

JAZZ/TAP, POMS & LYRICAL

- Tank Top, Sports Bra, Dance Shorts or Leggings
- Tan Jazz and Tap Shoes
- Bun or ponytail

ADULTS

- Workout Clothing
- Long Hair Up

ACRO

- Tank Top, Sports Bra, Dance Shorts
- Socks or Bare Feet
- Bun (ponytail hair gets in the way)

BALLET/TAP

- Purple/Pink/Black Leotard & Tights
- Pink Ballet & Tan Tap Shoes
- Bun or ponytail

CLASSICAL BALLET

- Black SDS Leotard and Pink Tights
- Pink Split Sole Leather Ballet Shoes
- Bun

MALE DANCERS

- Tee or Tank and Dark Pants/Shorts
- Black Shoes

PRODUCTION

- SDS Black Leotard & Pink or Tan Tights
- Bun
