Harold M. Mies Rifle Range Rules

THINK AND PRACTICE SAFETY

Club members in good standing are authorized to use the Harold M. Mies Rifle and Pistol Ranges. The Cowboy Town is off limits.

Range hours: 8 am till one hour before sunset, year round.

Check Club calendar for dates and times of range closures, prior to range use. All ranges are OPEN the second Saturday of every month for Cowboy Action Shooting. All ranges MAY be closed for special Cowboy Action Shooting events – check Club calendar.

Range use is limited to club members, and **one** guest only. Non-member shooters must be accompanied by a club member in good standing.

When ranges are in use, wait your turn.

If you witness anyone being irresponsible on the ranges, report it to the Club board members. Get member information or their license plate number. Memberships will be revoked.

SAFETY:

- Hearing and eye protection is required for anyone on the firing lines.
- All firearms on premises must be unloaded with actions open, or cased, unless in use.
- The breech of all firearms must remain open until shooter is on station.
- Muzzles of firearms are to point down range or skyward at all times.
- The berms are your backstops. All rifle and pistol shooting is limited to the backstops or targets placed directly in front of the berms.
- Use paper targets. (Rocks are not targets!)
- When changing targets down range (100 and 300 yard), make use of the cable across shooting benches to signal you are down range.
- Be respectful of other shooters.

PROHIBITED:

- No person under the age of 16 will be allowed to shoot without adult member supervision.
- No shooting without a backstop. (Avoid ricochets! Know your bullet stop!)
- No exploding targets.
- No fully automatic weapons, bump stocks, etc.
- No glass targets.
- Do not leave litter, targets, etc. This includes shell casings.
- No alcohol or drugs on ranges.
- No visibly intoxicated persons allowed on ranges.
- No vehicles allowed on ranges.
