

Romans 4. 13-22 :





Do you believe promises that are made to you? "Sometimes" you might say. It all depends on who makes the promise and whether they can be trusted. We trust those people who we believe will keep their promises.

So what about God? Romans 3 has focussed on the righteousness of God. God is the one who is righteous and because he is righteous he can be trusted. Romans 4 reminds us he made good on his promises to Abraham and assures us he will do the same for all who have faith.

God spoke to Abraham many times over the years. He promised that he would bless Abraham and make a great nation from him and that all peoples on earth would be blessed through him. God promised Abraham that he would have a son, Isaac, and Abraham believed God's promise even though humanly it seemed impossible. All through this, as Romans makes clear, despite his struggles, Abraham's faith in God was unwavering. As his life went on his faith and trust in a great God grew stronger. Verse 20 tells us *'No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God'* because he was *'...fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised'*. He trusted in God and God did not let him down. He gave God the glory. He knew that God's promise would not fail. This is the faith of Abraham that was reckoned to him as righteousness.

But what about us? Is our God today big enough, powerful enough, faithful enough to make good on his promises? Verse 23 tells us the words *'it was reckoned to him'* were not just written for Abraham's sake alone but for our sake, for all who read these words and that includes us today. God's promise to us is that he will reckon righteousness to all who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead. Just as God brought Isaac out of the (almost) dead, he raised Jesus from death. As Jesus was handed over to death for our sins, so he was raised to life for our justification. When we have faith we who were once dead in sin are made alive in Christ as he brings us new life. God's promise to Abraham was to bring life out of death and God's promise to us is to bring life out of death just as in Jesus' resurrection he brought life out of death. Our part is to

believe and trust in the promises of God, to have faith in God just as for his part Abraham believed and trusted and had faith in God.

God's promises are being fulfilled and his purposes accomplished in all those who have faith in him. May we be encouraged in our faith by the example not just of Abraham but of countless believing Christians who are made righteous by their faith in God who promise never fails.
