USING THE TABLE: In determining whole weeks in the course, disregard fractions of 3 days or less and consider fraction of 4 days or more as a full week. Determine training time by reading across the credit hour line to the number of weeks per term column. EXAMPLE: 5 semester hours in 10 weeks is 3/4 time. (This is the same result obtained from using the formula specified in 38 CFR 21.4272(g): $5 \times 18 = 90$ divided by 10 = 9 sem. hrs. which is 3/4 training.)
