Not the AUSTRALIA DAY TOUR. Held 23rd, 24th and 25th September 2022

It had been a long time coming but finally the Mount Gambier Veteran And Vintage Car Club was finally able to hold our annual tour usually reserved for the Australia day long weekend, but this year postponed until September when the sun is once again shining and Spring is in the air. After the disappointment of having to cancel the clubs main event early in the year our tour committee had regrouped and been working hard through the winter months to re organise the tour, and now into Spring, finally the time had come, the Tour weekend was upon us.

On Friday afternoon the club rooms were open to welcome tour entrants and a varied and colourful array of vehicles began to fill the grounds, it was a time to make new acquaintance and shake the hand of an old friend, after all the tour is all about the people and fellowship we share. The "old tin" we travel in is the common interest that brings us all together and Friday afternoon to entertain us a visit to a modern new truck workshop was organised. The workshop is part of the Barry Maney group and close enough to the club rooms that we could have walked to the facility, but this is the tour so cars and trucks were taken on the visit.

We were welcomed to the workshop by Leigh Thorne, a long time employee of the Barry Maney Group that had given us his time to host the tour so we could gain an insight into the happenings of a modern truck dealership. Leigh spoke highly of the company's philosophy towards its workers and support of local business and was very happy to demonstrate a truck hoist lifting a very large Kenworth high in the air so we could have a look at its underbelly, we were also permitted to climb aboard to look into the cab of a brand new, proudly built in Melbourne Australia Kenworth and get a view from the captains chair. Leigh was very happy answering our questions and spoke of the dollar value of these Goliaths of the road and how different customers require and expect different things, I thought chrome and bling were big in the 50's but when you see first hand and up close the accessories and mountains of shiny stuff being applied to some of these work horses it is on a scale all on its own. Friday concluded back at the club rooms for an evening of socialising and catching up over pizza and a beverage, looking forward to Saturday.

The sun had risen on a glorious spring Saturday and we were again greeting new arrivals and enjoying a cuppa and a chat at the club rooms before our mid morning departure for Kalangadoo. We travelled together taking the long way around through Pleasant Park then on to Tarpeena and turning off at Nangwarry for the final few country miles to Kalangadoo. Taking this route allowed us to amble along and enjoy the picturesque country side as we wound through hills of rolling green pasture, past native scrub and tall plantation timber, as our club president John Hill had mentioned in his welcome note to tour entrants our little part of the world certainly was looking beautiful and at its best, the paddocks are green, the live stock are plump, the crops are looking good, wild flowers are in bloom and there are plenty of ducks and swans on the swamps and water laying in red gum studded paddocks.

Our arrival in Kalangadoo was met by waving locals as we made our way to our designated parking ground, our tour providing a spectacular display of vehicles to compliment the Kalangadoo Spring Fair and proved to be quite an attraction in the town judging by the number of people who were making their way around the parking area admiring our cars. Our day in Kalangadoo was spent among the stalls of the School fete and the Spring Fair with a visit to the Kalangadoo Railway Museum where curator and retired railway man Peter Savage with his passion and eccentricity provided us with an entertaining insight into Kalangadoo's Rail history while club member Nick Hunt made sure we all got our lunches and the urn was hot back at Kalangadoo Institute Hall.

At our leisure we made our way back to Mount Gambier to once again congregate at our club rooms to enjoy the good company and fellowship found among tour entrants and for the traditional fine evening meal and the entertainment of the all important raffle draw that saw many happy winners taking home some excellent prizes courtesy of some generous sponsors. On average Mount Gambier has rain on 2 out of 3 days in September so we were fortunate with the favourable weather for touring holding out on Sunday morning as we rendezvoused at the Lady Nelson Visitor Centre to put our cars on public display and what a display we were able to put on with well over 50 automobiles spanning decades of motoring history and barely 2 alike. After a few words from club secretary Peter Roulstone and Mark Fulford from major sponsor, Bendigo Bank it was "Lady's and Gentlemen Start Your Engines" and we were off to explore the Compton lime stone quarries.

The short drive out to the quarry was a joy as we wound our way through the Compton back roads until we descended into the stark white pit that was the Gambier Earth Movers Lime stone quarry. The quarry is a very large hole in the ground so there was plenty of room to park our cars and gather by the tall stone shed where we were greeted by Antony Rice, a long time quarry man who seemed to delight in having an audience to share his knowledge and expertise of all facets of limestone and extracting the various forms of it from the ground as he gave an excellent and interesting talk covering the formation of the limestone, its special and unique proprieties and how there were different types of limestone extracted from the quarry used for different purposes. Perfectly timed cloud cover began to roll in reducing the glare and providing a comfortable ambiance in the stark white stone Quarry as Antony started up the stone saw and gave a demonstration of how the stone was cut from the ground, this seemed to spark off an entirely new array of questions from the audience, all expertly answered by Antony.

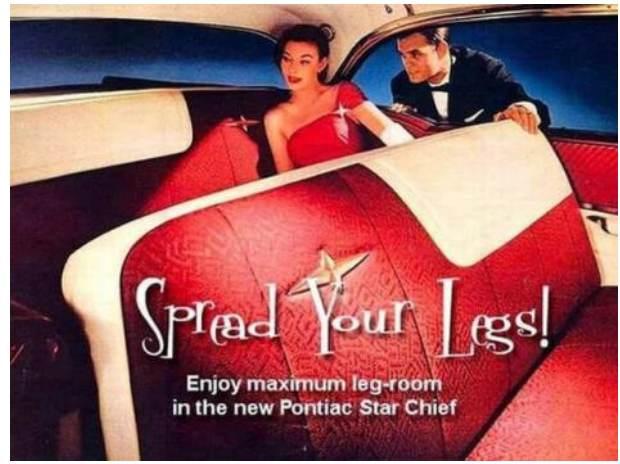
