EXCERPTS FROM THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH ON PRAYER

Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from God. (2559)

In the New Covenant, prayer is the living relationship of the children of God with their Father who is good beyond measure, with his Son Jesus Christ and with the Holy Spirit.


Thus the life of prayer is the habit of being in the presence of the thrice-holy God and in communion with him. (2565)

In his teaching, Jesus teaches his disciples to pray with a purified heart, with lively and persevering faith, with filial boldness. He calls them to vigilance and invites them to present their petitions to God in his name. Jesus Christ himself answers prayers addressed to him. (2621)

The prayers of the Virgin Mary, in her Fiat and Magnificat are characterized by the generous offering of her whole being in faith. (2622)







1. ACT OF FAITH

O my God, I firmly believe that you are one God in three divine Persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. I believe that your divine Son became man, died for our sins, and that He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe these and all the truths which the Holy Catholic Church teaches, because you have revealed them, who can neither deceive nor be deceived.

2. ACT OF HOPE

O my God, relying on your almighty power, infinite mercy and promises, I hope to obtain pardon for my sins, the help of your grace, and life everlasting through the merits of Jesus Christ, my Lord and Redeemer.

3. ACT OF LOVE

O my God, I love you above all things, with my whole heart and soul, because you are all-good and worthy of all love. I love my neighbor as myself for the love of you. I forgive all who have injured me and ask pardon of all who I have injured.

4. ACT OF CONTRITION

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended you, and I detest all my sins, because of your just punishments, but most of all because they offended you, my God, who are all-good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to sin no more and to avoid the near occasions of sin. Amen.

5. ANIMA CHRISTI

Soul of Christ, sanctify me. Body of Christ, heal me. Blood of Christ, drench me. Water from the side of Christ, wash me. Passion of Christ, strengthen me. Good Jesus, hear me. In your wounds, shelter me. From turning away, keep me. From the evil one, protect me. At the hour of my death, call me. Into your presence lead me, to praise you with all saints, forever and ever. Amen.

6. ANGELUS

- V. The angel of the Lord declared onto Mary.
- R. And she conceived of the Holy Spirit. Hail Mary ...
- V. Behold the handmaid of the Lord.
- R. Let it be done to me according to your word. Hail Mary . . .
- V. And the Word was made flesh.
- R. And dwelt among us. Hail Mary . . .
- V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.
- R. That we may be made worth of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray: O Lord, through the message of an angel we learned of the Incarnation of Christ, Your Son. Pour Your grace into our hearts, and by His passion and cross bring us to the glory of His Resurrection, through Christ, our Lord. Amen.

7. CHAPLET OF THE DIVINE MERCY

Using Rosary beads, begin with:

Our Father . . .

Hail Mary . . .

the Apostles Creed.

On the large bead before each decade say:

Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

On the ten small beads of each decade:

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

After the last decade, recite the following prayer three times:

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

8. GUARDIAN ANGEL PRAYER

Angel of God, my Guardian dear,

To whom God's love commits me here,

Ever this day be at my side

To light and guard, to rule and guide.

Amen.

9. HOLY SPIRIT PRAYER

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of Your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created and You shall renew the face of the earth.

O, God, who by the light of the Holy spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit, we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolations, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

10. THE MAGNIFICAT

(Luke 1:46-55)

The soul rejoices in the Lord

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant.

From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is his Name.

He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation.

He has shown the strength of his arm, He has scattered the proud in their conceit.

He has cast down the mighty from their thrones and has lifted up the lowly.

He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty.

He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he has remembered his promise of mercy, the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children forever.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever.

Amen.



11. MORNING OFFERING

O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer you my prayers, works, joys and sufferings of this day in union with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world. I offer them for all the intentions of your Sacred Heart: the salvation of souls, the reparation for sin, and the reunion of all Christians. I offer them for the intentions of our bishops and of all priests, and in particular for those recommended by our Holy Father this month.

12. MEMORARE

Remember, O most loving Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to your protection or sought your intercession was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto thee O Virgin, O Virgin, my Mother. To Thee I come, before Thee I stand sinful and sorrowful. Despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me. Amen.

13. PEACE PRAYER OF SAINT FRANCIS OF ASSISI

Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace. Where there is hatred, let me sow love; Where there is injury, pardon; Where there is doubt, faith; Where there is despair, hope; Where there is darkness, light; and Where there is sadness, joy. O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek To be consoled as to console; To be understood as to understand; To be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive; It is in pardoning that we are pardoned; and It is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen.

14. PRAYER OF SAINT MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL

Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the Devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou O Prince of heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

15. PSALM 23, THE LORD IS MY SHEPHERD

The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. In verdant pastures he gives me repose;

Beside restful waters he leads me; He refreshes my soul.

He guides me in right paths for his name's sake.

Only goodness and kindness follow me all the days of my life; and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord for years to come.


16. SERENITY PRAYER

15. THE PRAYER OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF CATHOLIC WOMEN


Heavenly Father,

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.


3. PRAYER FOR SOCIAL JUSTICE

7. CORPORAL WORKS OF MERCY MEDIATION

LEADER: Let us begin by putting ourselves in God's presence.

The first reading is adapted from I John 3:17-18:

"If someone who has means sees a sister or brother in need and refuses that person compassion, how can the love of God remain in that one? Children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in deed and truth."

(Allow a moment for meditation.)

LEADER: The second reading is taken from "Guadium et Spes:"

"Every social group must take into account the needs and legitimate aspirations of other groups, and even of the general welfare of the entire human family. At the same time, however, there is a growing awareness of the dignity proper to a human being since she stands above all things and her rights and duties are universal and inviolable. Therefore, there must be made available to all human beings everything necessary for leading life such as food, clothing, and shelter; the right to choose a state of life freely and to found a family; the right of education and employment; the right to a good reputation, to respect, to appropriate information, to activity in accord with the upright norm of one's own conscience, to protection of privacy and to rightful freedom, even in matters religious."

Loving God, make us aware of Your presence in all of creation. We are examples of Your life and Your beauty. May others know You by gazing upon the actions of our lives. Amen.

(Allow a moment for meditation.)

READING: Romans 12:9-17

LEADER: The fourth reading is taken from "Mater et Magistra:"

"When one is motivated by Christian charity, one cannot but love others, for charity is patient and kind; charity does not envy, is not pretentious, is not puffed up, is not ambitious, is not self-seeking, is not provoked, seeks no evil, does not rejoice over wickedness but rejoices with the truth, bears with all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things."

LEADER: O holy, most high God, sometimes we get so set in our ways, we are satisfied to sit in our security, to do the things we have always done, to act the way we have always acted. O gracious God, You call upon us to act in a different way. You call us to speak out against injustice and to make peace with those who hate us. Turn us toward Your Son. Uproot us from lives of comfort and help us to live lives of service to those in need.

ALL: Amen.

READING: Matthew 25:34-46 (adapted)

CORPORAL WORKS OF MERCY MEDITATION (cont.)

(Sections to be ready by the leader and alternate sides of the assembly.)

- LEADER: Then the king will say to those on his right: Come you who are blessed by My Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave Me food. I was thirsty and you gave Me drink, a stranger and you comforted Me, naked and you clothed Me, ill and you cared for Me, in prison and you came to visit Me.
- **RIGHT**: Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You or thirsty and give You drink? When did we see You a stranger and welcome You or naked and clothe You? When did we see You ill or in prison and visit You?
- **LEADER:** Then He will say to those on the left: Depart from Me you accursed into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave Me no food, thirsty and you gave Me no drink, a stranger and you gave me no welcome, naked and you gave Me no clothing, ill and in prison and you did not care for Me.
- **LEFT:** Lord, when did we see You hungry or thirsty or naked or a stranger or ill or in prison and not minister to Your needs?
- **LEADER:** He will answer them: Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least sisters and brothers of mine, you did to Me. Likewise, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for Me,

(Allow time for meditation)

LEADER: Merciful God, we are to serve You by serving our sisters and brothers, by being messengers of Your mercy. Help us to bring this message of concern to those in need, in the spirit of Your Son, Jesus Christ. Make us increasingly mindful of all who are in need. In humble service, may we seek to help the poor and deprived; those who are despairing and feel themselves beyond help. Make us mindful of our poverty and our need of You. We ask You this through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord and healer. Amen.



2. ADVENT PRAYER SERVICE

INTRODUCTION:

LEADER:	Our prayer service combines three Advent institutions: The Jesse Tree, the Advent Wreath, and the "O Antiphons." The "O Antiphons" were originally designed for use before and after the Magnificat during Vespers from December 17th to 23rd. Using a series of messianic titles, drawn largely from Isaiah, they call upon the Lord Jesus to come into our lives and save us. In the following service we use the seven antiphons as expressed in the familiar Advent Hymn, "O Come, O Come Emmanuel."
SONG:	"O Come, O Come Emmanuel," Verse 1, Refrain, Verse 2
LEADER:	This reading speaks of God, the source of all wisdom.
READING:	Sirach 1:1-10
LEADER:	An adaptation of Solomon's prayer for wisdom.
1 ST READING:	Wisdom 9:1-4
ALL:	God of our ancestors, Lord of mercy, who by your Word have made all things, and in your wisdom have given us the rule of creatures that come from you, and have asked us to govern the world in holiness and justice, grant us wisdom, and do not reject us from the number of your children. Amen.
LEADER:	God has acted in human history over and over again. We hear an account of God's beginning to work through Moses and the people of Israel.
2 ND READING:	Exodus 3:1-3, 3:4-8, 11-14
SONG:	"O Come, O Come Emmanuel", Verse 3, Refrain; Verse 4, Refrain
MOVEMENT:	The Jesse Tree is brought in. Paper "leaves" are now distributed. Write on it one way in which you are preparing for the Lord's coming. Each participant then takes his or her turn attaching the leaf to the Jesse tree. Each receives an unlit candle.
SONG:	"O Come, O Come Emmanuel", Verse 5, Refrain
3RD READING:	ClosedchainsprisonconfinementdarknessThere are many ways in which we choose to ignore that your life has come into the world. Be with us, Lord, as we examine our ways and attempt to break free from those, which hinder us from seeing your presence.
MOVEMENT:	Silent Reflection
ALL:	Lord, we acknowledge that you can open locked hearts, break the chains which hold us from one another, free us from the prisons of our own making, and bring light to our darkness. You are the Lord. We ask that we be able to truly recognize you as Emmanuel God-with-us. Amen.


5. CHRISTIANS IN ACTION

- **LEADER:** God calls all people into service to others. Let us be Christians in Action. As we pause and reflect on our own lives, how do we respond to this statement?

- LEADER: "The essence of the Christian ministry is personal service. Jesus sets forth the principle that one's readiness to serve is the standard by which his greatness as a minister is to be evaluated. The earliest ministry of the Church was that of the twelve Apostles and then Paul. The Prophets, the Evangelists, and the Teachers who followed built up the life in the early Church and applied these teachings to the ethical and moral life of all people. The New Testament portrays the Church as the Spirit-filled body of Christ, whose life is sustained and enriched by each member's use of his particular gifts. In this sense every member of the church may be considered a true minister of Christ. Christians in Action!"
- READING: ROMANS 12:4-8
- LEADER: Psalm 119, Adapted from Psalms Now
- **LEFT:** O God, I want so very much to please You, to walk in your ways and to carry out Your purposes. There is nothing as important to me as being in the center of Your will and living within Your design for my life.
- **RIGHT:** While others may find their fulfillment in the acquisition of wealth or the accumulation of things, in doing something better than everyone else, or in the plaudits of their peers, my foremost desire is to be the object of Your love and to be Your child and servant forever.
- LEFT: Not only have You fashioned me with Your hands, O Lord, and created me for Your purposes. You have stamped Your image upon my heart. Therefore my deepest longings are met only in You and in the dedication of my life to the accomplishment of Your objectives.
- **RIGHT:** How can I live a life that is pleasing to You, O Lord? My instincts are earthbound. The ephemeral delights of this life tantalize and tempt me. My insatiable longings and desperate attempts to please You are thwarted by the innumerable enemies of my soul.
- LEFT: I fail so often to do what I really want to do, to attain what I strive for; to grasp what I reach for; and I fall back in shame and am flattened in despair.
- **RIGHT**: You do forgive me when I fail, O Lord, and You put me upon my feet again. You have promised to strengthen me and to sustain me in my daily conflicts. Now I pray for the wisdom to discern Your will and the grace to carry it out in the difficult days before me.
- LEFT: You have shown me how much You love me, Lord; now show me how to love You. Your standards for me are clear: I am to translate Your love into terms that others can comprehend, to demonstrate it before those that know and see me. (continued)

CHRISTIANS IN ACTION (cont.)

- **RIGHT:** I can serve You only as I commit my life to service on behalf of my brothers and sisters. I can offer sacrifices to You only by way of the altar of my neighbor's need. This is Your law, Your standard, Your design and will for my life. This is the way in which I will be pleasing to You.
- **LEFT:** I do love You, O God, and Your will for me is the delight of my heart. I have a sincere love for many people who cross my path, and I rejoice in the privilege of serving them. And yet, O Lord, there are so many people whom I do not love.
- **RIGHT:** The demons of bigotry and apathy and jealously and selfishness plague my soul and numb my sensitivities and stay my hand from reaching out to help my fellowman. I sin against You when I sin against them, and I need to be restored and renewed by Your loving touch.
- **LEFT:** How I praise You, O Lord, because You love me even when I fail to respond in loving obedience! Whereas I cannot comprehend You, You do understand me, and You continue to hold me within Your loving embrace.
- **RIGHT:** While I fall short of my sincere intentions to abide within Your will for me, Your promises are eternally secure, and You tenderly and patiently rekindle the fires within me. Empower me to do that which I cannot do by myself.
- ALL: I love You, O God, and I gladly accept Your will and purpose for my life. Now bless me and guide me and grant me the grace to walk within that will and purpose and have the joy of knowing that I am pleasing to You.

As a diocesan organization, we place ourselves under the patronage of Mary, our Mother and the Mother of Jesus. In addition, each of our officers is given a special woman in our tradition as her patroness.

LEADER: May I present to you our treasurer:

As treasurer, you hold a trustworthy and important position. You will receive all monies and dispense all funds according to the rules of (name organization). Just as the stem of this rose balances it and gives perfect order to the leaves, so too, will your office demand preciseness and integrity. To you we give the patroness, St. Teresa of Avila, who was a model of integrity and was trusted by the leaders of the Church in her time.

You will also be a support person for our president, one on whom she can always call for advice and direction, just as the stem of the rose is the support system for its nourishment. To you we give the patroness, Ruth of the Old Testament, for her loyalty and fidelity to Naomi was a constant source of strength.

LEADER: May I present to you our president:

As president, you are ultimately responsible for the leadership of this organization. You will delegate responsibilities, lead your board of directors, and represent (name organization) with grace and dignity. You will represent (name organization) at all (arch)diocesan functions and will be available for all (members or affiliations) when called upon. You will be an ambassador of love and good will just as the rose is symbolic of the love and good will that exist in the world of natural order. 9. LENTEN JOURNEY OF LOVE

A cross is constructed of wood or formed with votive candles. A votive candle is lighted each of the weeks of Lent; if there are six weeks, those closest to the center are last.

- LEADER I: The first week of Lent is a time when we have the great opportunity to love in a way that is unique. It gives us the chance to walk with Christ in a Journey of Love. It is a time when the events in the public life of Jesus Christ are spread before us to meditate to ponder over and then to imitate the virtues presented.
- LEADER II: This first week in our Journey of Love, let us show the HAND OF LOVE.
 Light the first votive
 By writing a letter to a friend or relative, let them know that you care. Let it be someone you have not communicated with for a long time. Tell them how much you miss them, how much you appreciate them and how much you love them.
- **LEADER I:** Dear Jesus, let our hands be more like yours. May all those we touch feel our gentle concern. As your hand touched people, you brought them closer to your heart and made them believe. They knew you truly cared. Glory be to the Father...
- ALL: As it was in the beginning . . .
- **LEADER I:** The second week of Lent is a time when we concentrate on Lent as a positive sign and season. The public life of Our Lord is set before us. He went out preaching to all men - manifesting God's great love and concern for mankind. Now is the time for us to reaffirm our faith, that life does not end with death and that the Cross is the sign of eternal love.
- **LEADER II:** This second week in our Journey of Love, let us show the VOICE OF LOVE.

Light second votive

Telephone two or three people each day for a brief chat. Especially include those who are alone – just say – "How are you?" "Thank you" or "I'm sorry." Tell a lonely person, "I'm thinking of you." You will probably make their day.

- LEADER I: Dear Jesus, your voice spoke only words of kindness, words of forgiveness, words of love - help us all to be more like you in our daily work and conversation. Have us remember that we should do unto others as we would have them do unto us. Glory Be to the Father . . .
- ALL: As it was in the beginning . . .
- **LEADER I:** The third week of Lent is a time of intense prayer. Let us stop and take a good look at ourselves so far. It is time for us to be more devout in our prayers and also devote more time to religious exercises. It is the time for us to review and study the important matters of our faith. 
