July 26 – Saint Anne & Saint Joachim


Saint Anne, whose Hebrew name means gracious, married Saint Joachim, and from this marriage was born the most holy and immaculate Virgin Mary, Mother of God. If Mary is blessed among all women because she gave the world its Saviour, what a glorious privilege for Saint Anne to have given birth to this beloved creature of God, who appeared on the pure land like the lily between the thorns, all beautiful and spotless in her conception, as in all her life! Saint Joachim and Saint Anne were both publicly honored in the Church from the first centuries. Saint John Damascene gives great praise to their virtues. In various countries, chapels have been built in honor of Saint Anne, and have become famous by an immense crowd of pilgrims and a great number of miracles. God wanted to show, by these prodigies, how much he approves of the devotion of the faithful towards a saint who, in addition to her august title of mother of Mother of God, was an accomplished model of virtues for people engaged in the married state.

July 29 - Saints Martha, Mary and Lazarus

Saints Martha, Mary and Lazarus were siblings, and all three were friends of Jesus. In expanding this feast day by adding Mary and Lazarus to the day honouring Martha, the papal decree establishing this memorial reads: "In the household of Bethany, the Lord Jesus experienced the family spirit and friendship of Martha, Mary and Lazarus, and for this reason the Gospel of John states that he loved them. Martha generously offered him hospitality, Mary listened attentively to his words, and Lazarus promptly emerged from the tomb at the command of the One who humiliated death." Their three-fold witness "in welcoming the Lord Jesus into their home, in listening attentively, and in believing that he is the resurrection and the life" is celebrated this day.
