During our stays, we consider ourselves temporary custodians of the owners and once our rental is over, we leave the property as pristine as we found it. Finally, we LOVE Carmel/Monterey and think it's one of God's most inspired creations. And when we have the opportunity to spend a few days there in a lovely rental property, we feel we experience what it is truly like to live in Carmel/Monterey in all its splendor. We understand that the monthly minimum stay rule is an attempt to preserve the splendor of Carmel/Monterey, but we feel that, ultimately, the decision to rent to whom and for how long should reside solely with the property owner.
