The City of Adelaide was built in 1864 and transported passengers to Adelaide until 1887. It is a composite clipper ship, the world's oldest one with the only other surviving composite ship the younger Cutty Sark which is in the UK. In 1893 it became an isolation hospital near Southampton then it was taken over by the Royal Navy with a change of name to HMS Carrick and was used as a drill ship on the River Clyde in Scotland.

It then sank in the River Clyde and finally moved onto a private slip in Irvine Scotland. A group of volunteers spent many years getting it back to South Australia and in 2013 HRH The Duke of Edinburgh renamed it back to its original name before its final journey to Adelaide.

After the movie we were all taken aboard the clipper taking in what it looked like originally and what work has been done to it.

Almost a quarter of a million Australians' heritage can be traced back to passengers and crew of the City of Adelaide.

To help with the renovations they hold dinners, small groups, weddings and even ghost tours.

Jenson was asked how many rats and cats (stuffed toy animals not real ones) and he won a Piggy Bank and a Pen for his efforts.

Around 1 pm it was back for lunch and what a lovely lunch it was. A choice of soups, finger food and small cakes for dessert.
