We are indebted to those parishioners who see things to be done and do them. Much of the work of the parish continues. Please keep me informed about anyone you know who might like a pastoral visit.

We know those who are mourning the loss of loved ones, we continue to pray for them and support them at this difficult time for them


As churches REOPEN from Monday 10th May 2021.
