"It is an experience I will never forget," said Ben, "We were treated like kings." Everywhere they went people cheered and gave them hugs. They toured all of the memorials in Washington D.C. including the Vietnam Veterans Memorial. Ben entered the Navy in August 1968 at age 19. He served on the USS King DLG10, a guided missile destroyer. The USS King was in support of the USS Kittyhawk carrier group. Ben had multiple assignments including working with the 5 inch gun magazines. He remembers the aft engine room fire that took the life of four of his shipmates. He found their names on the wall.
