FDA Presentation on Import Safety

FDA recently released a presentation, <u>Proposed Rules to Help Ensure the Safety of Imported Food</u>, to provide an overview of the Proposed Regulations for Foreign Supplier Verification Programs and the Proposed Rule for Accreditation of Third-Party Auditors.

Contamination of Public-Supply Wells

The U.S. Geological Survey has released a report that describes key factors that have been identified that help determine the vulnerability of public-supply wells to contamination, providing insight into which contaminants in an aquifer might reach a well and when, how, and at what concentration they might arrive.

2012 State of the Climate Report

2012 was "one of the 10 warmest years on record globally," according to the 2012 "State of the Climate" report released by the American Meteorological Society, which found among other things that warm temperature trends continue near Earth's surface; the Arctic continues to warm; and sea ice extent has reached a record low.

U.S. EPA Climate Change Indicators

U.S. EPA is working with many other organizations to better understand the causes and effects of climate change. With help from these partners, U.S. EPA has compiled a set of 26 <u>indicators</u> tracking signs of climate change. Also, <u>U.S. EPA Administrator Gina McCarthy recently discussed President's Obama's Climate Action Plan</u>, which was announced on June 25, 2013.

USA Today Article—Lead Poisoning Increases Suspension Rate

USA Today <u>recently published an article</u> about a study done in Wisconsin in which it was found that children with even just moderate blood lead levels as toddlers were almost three times more likely to be suspended from school by the time they were nine or ten years old compared to children below the treatment threshold.
