Ignorance of Blasphemy of the Holy Spirit

Does not an effort to combat those whose mission it is to "Trash God, Trash Jesus, Trash the Gospel of Jesus, Trash Salvation" draw more attention to them and their mission? I would rather broadcast this (or something like it):

Mat 12:32 And whosoever speaketh a word against the Son of man, it shall be forgiven him: but whosoever speaketh against the Holy Spirit, it shall not be forgiven him, neither in this world, neither in the world to come.

Acts 2:12 & 2:13 And they were all amazed, and were in doubt, saying one to another, What meaneth this (*speaking in tongues, or languages*)? Others mocking said, These men are full of new wine

(This has become identified as the most common evidence of one being filled with the Holy Spirit of God! Is it possible those that mocked may have been prevented by the Holy Spirit from discerning anything except gibberish? After all, were they not ridiculing (mocking) the Holy Spirit?

See the explanation in Matthew 12:31 and 12:32.

Mat 12:31 Wherefore I say unto you, All manner of sin and blasphemy shall be forgiven unto men: but the blasphemy *against* the *Holy* Ghost shall not be forgiven unto men.

Mat 12:32 And whosoever speaketh a word against the Son of man, it shall be forgiven him: but whosoever speaketh against the Holy Ghost, it shall not be forgiven him, neither in this world, neither in the *world* to come.

Question:

Can one blasphemy the work of the Holy Spirit out of ignorance and be forgiven? I believe we should hope and pray that is the case!

Salvation is a work of the Holy Spirit; don't mock, Please! Forgiveness may not be possible).

Infilling of the Holy Spirit – The "Born Again" person is given access to what the God and Father of Jesus intends (*or promised*) of His authority (*the Keys of the Kingdom of Heaven*) after that person's conversion to the Lord Jesus Christ; according to John 3:16! It is well known, most; even dedicated followers of Jesus do not agree what this, "Infilling of the Holy Spirit" means, exactly!

Yours truly is persuaded it is when the Holy Spirit of God is allows (*and willingly permits*) to recreate, and be the new Spirit in the born again person that has already declared his, or her conversion to Jesus; the savior!

The most obvious evidence of the *converted sinner* being filled with the Holy Spirit is that which was demonstrated on the Day of Pentecost in Acts Chapter 2; thus, speaking with other tongues, or languages!

And so the question arises again, and again, "is speaking with other tongues the only sign of the converted sinner being filled with the Holy Spirit"?

No one can change what God intended (one might misrepresent; and often do misrepresent, ignore, not believe, maybe even delay; but we can not change what God intend(s)); and I believe I know what you are thinking! But then Jesus was not a sinner, was He? But God manifested in human flesh; absent of His God Head Authority

and Power(s) (not yet filled (or infilled) with the Holy Spirit, until the day of His water baptism by John the Baptist!)? And after this event, His many "signs and wonders, or miracles" that followed were gloriously convincing indeed; of God the Father, God the Holy Spirit; in and with Him!

It was at His water baptism that Jesus, "received; was anointed with; baptized with" this awesome Authority and Power forever; showing forth miracles, "having been infilled with the Holy Spirit without measure" as described by John 3:30 through 3:34! However, the water baptism only served as a sign; a point of newness! Perhaps, even a formality, if you will! And any work required being done, was done of God by the Holy Spirit; Amen!

As stated of scripture: We see this first in *Genesis Chapter 1* (And the Spirit (*Holy Spirit*) of God moved upon the face (*or surface?*) of the waters. And God said let there be ...); and it was so!

Jesus spoke of this authority and power again when He gave His followers the great commission in *Matthew 28:18 through 28:20*:

Mat 28:18 And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth.

Mat 28:19 Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them (with water!) in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost (or Holy Spirit):

Mat 28:20 Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. (And you shall succeed in telling the world of your generation about salvation; eternal life; the atoning grace of God (or the God Head: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?); and life of rest in me, because I shall give you the "Keys of the Kingdom of Heaven; the Comforter; the Holy Spirit"; described of the Acts Chapter 2 event!) Amen.
