Welcome back everyone! We hope you had a great break over Christmas, and we are excited to see you all again. We would love to welcome our new friends, Emre, Nicholas, Aodhan, Clarke, Milyerra, Willow and Bart to the Joey Room!

Last month, we kicked things off by learning about Australian Animals. At group time, we read books about different Australian animals and the children seem to be enjoying the stories. For craft we have even made some Australian animals. The children were provided with the opportunity to practice their scissor skills as they cut the spikes of their echidnas.

We then moved onto celebrating Chinese New Year. The children loved banging on the table as they stamped fireworks and use bottles to make rainbow cherry blossoms on a tree outline. We also cut and decorated our own lanterns to hang up in our room. We finished off this focus by cooking some fried rice with the children. Everybody agreed it was delicious, going back for seconds or even thirds.





Outside, the Joey's have really been enjoying riding the bikes, throwing and catching the balls and playing on the climbing equipment. These outdoor play activities provide the children with opportunities to develop their gross motor skills, as they practice their foot eye coordination, balancing skills and spatial awareness. We ask that if you haven't already, can you please send in a helmet for your child to wear.

We have also been focussing on the children's self-help skills. This includes washing their own hands, putting on their own shoes, tidying up their room, transitioning onto sleeping on a bed, sitting at group time and toilet training. An extremely popular activity that many of us did over the break was going to the beach. To follow on from this interest, we set up a beach/ under the sea themed corner. We engaged in activities, like sensory play, puzzles, memory games, craft and reading books at group time to explore all the cool things we might find at the beach or in the ocean. The children especially like to engage in self-initiated dramatic play with the large sea creatures.

Outside the children have been loving all the new equipment in the big yard. The trampoline, stilts and climbing frames have been extremely popular with the children as they continue to challenge their developing gross motor skills. They have also been getting creative in the mud kitchen, cooking up a storm with all the natural resources that they find around the yard.



To follow on with the interest in meal preparation, we have been cooking with the children. They are a great help when measuring, pouring, and stirring the mixture. So far, we have made Zucchini slice, pancakes, fried rice, and dumplings. We cannot wait to see what else we

will cook in the months to come.

We would like to welcome our new Snake friends and their families into our Snake room.

Everyone has settled in well and is loving being in the 'big' Snake room.

We have been working on developing each child's feelings of 'belonging' and identity in their new room. We have a special belonging tree on our lockers where the children can hang their names upon arrival. This promotes their sense of belonging in their new room. We set up an 'our Country Australia' discovery area for the children to explore. There are Australian animals to investigate as well as many literacy items incorporating Australian animal books and pictures. We drew some fantastic animals and discussed our favourite Australian animals and something unique about them. We had fun retelling one of our favourite stories 'Wombat Stew'. The children all added the stew ingredients into the billycan whilst they told the story using the Australian animals. This type of experience promotes drama, language, and literacy skills.

Two weeks ago, we also celebrated Chinese New Year. We all danced to Chinese music in our Chinese lion costumes. Others played instruments whilst they watched their friends dancing. Αt lunchtime we



enjoyed eating some yummy Chinese food including fried rice, dumplings, and spring rolls.

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### News from the Office ...

#### **Immunisations**

Thank you to everyone who has recently sent through their children's updated immunisation history statements. Please ensure that you email or bring in your children's documentation after each immunisation as we are legally required to keep these statements on file.

#### **Confirming your income with Services Australia for 2018 – 2019**

Services Australia (the government body administering child care subsidy) has asked us a child care provider to share the following information with you. In short, all you need to do is either have your 2018 -2019 tax return lodged with the ATO or inform them that no lodgement of a tax return is required. The ATO will feed your income details to Services Australia who will use this information for child care subsidy balancing purposes. The following information is copied straight from the Services Australia letter:

Did you get Child Care Subsidy for 2018-19? If you got Child Care Subsidy (CCS) for the 2018-19 financial year, you must confirm your income. Most parents have already done this. If you haven't, do it now. If you don't confirm your income by 31 March 2021, your CCS will reduce to 0%. This means you'll need to pay full fees when you access child care. The deadline for confirming your income was extended from 30 June 2020 to 31 March 2021 because of COVID-19. If you confirm your income after 31 March 2021 we can start your CCS again. But if there's a gap between your CCS stopping and starting again, you'll miss out on CCS for that time. We sent letters to families in February 2021 asking them to confirm their income. How to confirm your income You don't need to call or visit us to confirm your income. You need to either: • lodge your tax return with the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) • tell us you don't need to lodge one and confirm your income online. If you have a partner, they'll need to do this too. If you separated during the year, we'll also need your ex-partner's income. To check if you need to lodge a return, use the Do I need to lodge a tax return? tool on ato.gov.au If you've lodged your tax return, the ATO will send us your income information. We usually get this within 28 days from when you get your Notice of Assessment. If you or your partner don't need to lodge a tax return, you need to let us know. You must do this, even if you've told the ATO that you don't need to lodge. You can do this and confirm your income for the year using either your: • Centrelink online account through myGov • Express Plus Centrelink mobile app.
