

DOOR COUNTY S.H.O.W. DRILL TEAM ENTRY INFORMATION

Competition Date: Saturday, August 5, 2017 at 12:00 noon Location: John Miles Fair Park (fairgrounds), Sturgeon Bay, WI

• Limit: 10 teams

• Competition Divisions: Novice & Open

• Arena Size: 125 x 280 (separate entry and exit gates on west end of arena)

Sound System: CDs can be submitted the morning of the event.

• Entry Fee: \$75.00

- Overnight Accommodations: Camp on the grounds (no stalls available); offsite stalls available (see reverse)
- Directions from Green Bay: Follow Highway 54/57 North to Sturgeon Bay (do not take business exit). After crossing the bridge, turn left at the 3rd intersection/second round-a-bout (Alabama Street/County T (there is a Pick N' Save grocery store on your left). Follow Alabama Street approximately .75 mile, turn left into Fairgrounds entrance (just past the only farm on the road).
- Overnight parking area for Drill Team members is directly inside the fairgrounds on the left.
- Day parking is straight ahead, just inside the fence a parking attendant will be on hand to direct you on Saturday prior to the show. If you are planning on coming in Friday night, you must contact Faye in advance to make arrangements.
- Please allow enough time to check in prior to competition.
- All teams will be allowed warm up time in the arena (arena is open and available to drill teams from 8:00 pm to 11:30 pm).
- All teams are expected to participate in the opening ceremony, as well as the awards ceremony following the competition.
- What we need from you:
 - Provide an introduction to be read describing your team (please type). You may provide you own emcee for your team.
 - Waiver forms must be signed in advance to lessen delays on competition day, please return in advance (authorization for those under 18 must be notarized)
 - Original and copy of Coggins with registration (Wisconsin law requires Coggins original to be shown, copy to stay with event coordinators; must include Premise ID number).
 - Music CD turn in at the Judge's Stand the morning of the competition.
 - Names of riders due one week in advance (for inclusion in the Drill Team program)
- Paperwork due to Pamela Parks one week prior to the event.
- Happy Ads available for purchase in the Drill Team program. Wish your team good luck, or
 advertise your own events! 300 programs are printed and distributed to the audience. Ad may be
 created for you, or send your own with the enclosed form. Proceeds are returned for payback.
- Please be ready near the arena at your scheduled competition time.
- Fair tickets are required for admittance 1 per member plus 2 additional will be provided for your team. Additional riders/family members will be required to pay at the gate.

- Competition is held during the Door County Fair. Our arena is away from most of the activity, but there are a few rides near the end of the arena; please be aware that your horse will be near these rides. Please walk your horse to the arena/warm-up area. The Fair Board restricts riding on the grounds during the fair for everyone's safety.
- Please clean up after yourself and your horse!
