Fossicking Districts

We have been making progress on new fossicking districts in NSW. Since August last new Gazetted LGAs include: Narrabri, Cootamundra, Upper Lachlan and Guyra, Bathurst (which covers Hill End) and Walcha.

Bega, Brand and Goulburn-Mulwaree Shires have also indicated they want to become fossicking Districts, and there are others with whom we are in contact to promote the idea.

We are pleased with progress but it has required a lot of intensive follow up with the councils. These are the first new fossicking districts in NSW since 2001.

Glen Innes and gemstone fossicking

I also went to the Minerama Show at <u>Glen Innes</u> several weeks ago and was very pleasantly surprised by the numbers of gem fossickers and of all the goodies they find – like sapphire, zircon, and topaz. I outlined NAPFA's work at the official Minerama dinner as well.

Next time you are in the area, take the time to spend a few days and you just might get lucky!

There are lots of public lands you can get onto and many property owners allow camping and fossicking for a fee. Fred at the Tourism Visitors Centre is a fantastic source of knowledge and location advice for you.
