Father Ted's Message

Hello Friends.

I would like to reflect on the beautiful story of *Les Miserables*. It's one of my favorites. It's a story of a man called Jean Valjean.

He had just spent 19 years in the galleys for stealing bread to feed his family. When he was released, he not only had a record, but he was considered dangerous. No one would hire someone like that. After several days and starving, he found himself at a Bishop's residence. The Bishop warmly received him, fed him, and invited him to spend the night. In the middle of the night,

Valjean left the Bishop's residence stealing his sterling silver candlesticks. The next day, he was brought before the Bishop by the detective with the candle sticks. The Bishop told the detective that he had given the candlesticks to him. The detective then released Valjean and left. The Bishop then said this to Valjean, "Forget not, never forget that you have promised me to use this silver to become an honest man. You belong no longer to evil, but to good. It is your soul that I am buying for you."

It was a turning point for Valjean who spent the remainder of his life doing good and changing many lives. At the end of his life he gave those candlesticks to his adopted daughter saying to her, "I have done what I could. There is scarcely anything else in the world but to love one another."

May we also do what we can, and may we too strive to love one another.

HDCCW participated for years in a successful "Water for Life" project which provided wells, irrigation and vessels to villages in Africa and South America. They partnered with the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops on legislative issues such as respect life, health care, and family violence. Our council also worked with Catholic Relief Services promoting fair trade and Cross Catholic Outreach collecting Boxes of Joy.

The "White Ribbon against Pornography" campaign was responsible for cars driving with white ribbons hanging from their antennas. When antennas disappeared, our women became creative with white ribbon cross pins, articles in church bulletins, local papers, and the Catholic Witness for awareness.

I was watching a PBS special documentary on Hemingway and painting my nails. Then I got a call that rings in my head so often. "Mom, Austin shot himself. He passed away." cried my daughter, Sallee.

The short drive to her house was awful, thinking I did not hear that, my husband Randy crying no, no, no, no. The next few days, weeks, months, were a blur of sadness.

Somehow I thought to contact my friend, Bonnie Onomastico, to let her know I couldn't attend the 2021 HDCCW Convention because the funeral for my 16 year old grandson was the same day.

I did find peace, comfort, and God's touch in many, many ways. Sympathy cards arrived from family and friends, but many came from my Catholic sisters throughout the diocese who didn't even know me. I treasure those cards. Grief never ends and the thoughts and prayers mean just as much as the day I received them.

By late fall, I was finally able to watch the Convention online and was again comforted and reminded that I could "Rejoice and be Thankful" for all God's works.

Thank you, God, for my new job at Greencastle Presbyterian Church, rejoicing in two church families to care for me and my family.

Thank you, God, for the pastor I work with, whose son had committed suicide 10 years earlier, rejoicing in my counselor friend who understands (plus he was baptized Catholic).

Thank you, God, for Sallee's new job at Brook Lane Health Services, an emotional and behavioral health care facility, rejoicing that she is surrounded by professionals who can help her all the time.

Thank you, God, for the many young people who spoke at Austin's funeral, rejoicing in a wonderful, caring, and funny young man.

Thank you, God, for the gift of Mary, my Blessed Mother, rejoicing in the inspiration she is to me.

Thank you, God, for the faith you have revealed to me. I rejoice in your love.

We think the anxiety and isolation of 2020 Covid was too much for Austin to deal with, but we'll never know. I do know, and I keep this image in my mind – he is cradled tightly and lovingly by Jesus, giving him a gentle kiss on the forehead.

I have been a member of Holy Spirit Parish in Palmyra since 2001, when we moved into the Hershey area from Harrisburg.

When did you become aware of your vocation?

My primary vocation is wife to my husband Rich of 21 years and mother to my three boys (Richie 18, Ryan 15 and Reece 13). I am very grateful for God's hand in leading me to Rich and choosing me to be the mother of my boys.

My secondary vocation is without a doubt to serve God and His Church. I feel very strongly He called me to it. After experiencing a miscarriage early on in our marriage, I fell into a very difficult season with bouts of anxiety, panic attacks and depression. What turned me around was an invitation to Eucharistic Adoration by my mother, Cheryl. She told me to go, visit your chapel and pray in front of the monstrance. She assured me Jesus would help me. So I did. The peace that comes to you in Adoration is like no other! I began to crave this time with Jesus. In time, I was healed. I was not only healed from the miscarriage, but from so many other things. All you need to do is show up and give Him your undivided attention and you find Him. He is love! He is Joy! He is absolutely amazing! He heals! And He sits and waits for us to come visit Him.
