Trevor's Column

Dear sisters and brothers,

As we continue in our sermon series on Making A Difference for Christ on what has been called our 'frontline' in our everyday relational encounters with folk in our social networks, I have been writing columns each week about some essentials in Christian mission. To date I have mentioned the essential of talking to God in prayer about these daily encounters, and the power of good deeds as we seek to live for God. But there is a third essential in creating confidence in Christ, namely speaking for God. If our living is not interpreted people may confuse us with other people, such as members of Lions or Rotary who also seek to do good in the community. That is why God wants us all of us to bear verbal witness to Christ in the places where he has put us. In particular, he wants us to give a reason for the hope we have in Jesus (1 Peter 3:14-15).

Writing to fearful Christians in a hostile environment. Peter urges his readers and us to stand up and be counted. He says we must reverence *Christ as Lord* in our inmost being, reminding ourselves that we have nothing to fear in life or death if our faith is in our risen saviour. Instead we need to be always ready and willing to declare we belong to him. The word used here is *apology*, which in our world means saying you are sorry, but in the New Testament means a defence. It means not hiding the fact that we belong to Jesus. This means we all need to know what we believe and be able to state it simply as best as we are able when we are put on the spot. It will also mean being ready to explain why we behave as we do because we want to thank Jesus who is transforming us.

This is why he insists we must focus on the reason for our hope. This gives our witness a distinct edge in a world full of bleak news. 'Hope' is particularly needed today in a pandemic world with increased mental illness. We need to remember our faith is not just about forgiveness for the past, it is about purpose in the present and being raised with Christ in the future in a totally renewed creation. I would encourage you all to be ready to tell your own personal first hand story of hope which comes from belonging to Jesus. There is nothing more powerful than your own story of how he sustains you now and gives you confidence for the future. But remember how we speak is just as important as what we say. When we are under pressure it is tempting to be impatient, hot headed and argumentative. Not surprisingly Peter says we must answer with gentleness and respect.

This means that despite the current cultural challenges, many parents in our communities have consented to their children receiving a spiritual foundation for their lives.

Last Sunday a full complement of voluntary teachers were commissioned for this mission which means all classes are currently covered. We therefore thank God for his providence in providing keen, qualified people to spearhead this crucial ministry.

The work in Ulladulla High school remains a real matter for prayer with timetabling issues meaning the appointed teacher is no longer available. Please pray for the appointment of a suitable person or for creative, alternative solutions to maintain a foothold for the gospel in this setting.

Let Your Voice Be Heard

As we have been reminded in our Frontline Sermon series, active Christians are a minority in our post Christian culture but can make a difference in our unique relational networks. Another area where as a minority we need to be active for Christ is in the issues confronting our society. We may no longer win the day on issues like Christian prayer before a Shoalhaven Council meeting or even in submissions to Federal Parliament about the need for protection in Religious Discrimination legislation, but our voice still needs to be heard. Those who don't like our position on key ethical issues remain very active about the Voluntary Assisted Dying Bill 2021 which will soon be introduced into the NSW Legislative Council. As a result the Hon. Greg Donnelly MLC has circulated a petition which reads as follows -

'To the President and Members of the Legislative Council, the petitioners of New South Wales state that that they are completely opposed to the passage of the Voluntary Assisted Dying Bill 2021, in any form, which provides for state sanctioned/funded assisted suicide/euthanasia. A cornerstone of our legal system is that ALL human life has inherent value and must be treated with dignity and respect. The petitioners request that the House unanimously oppose the bill, in any form, and reject it.'
