10th anniversary ride through rural South Australia for country cancer patients

By a stroke of good luck I found these people having a short refreshment break at Stockyard Reserve and was fascinated by their endeavours. I also chatted to one of the volunteers, Richard Wilson of Echunga, (photo below) who, it transpired, used to spend summer holidays at Denis and Karen Wundke's farm at Condowie!

The following information was provided by the Supercycle publicity officer.

On Saturday 20 March, 34 cyclists began a 1,000km journey through rural South Australia, raising funds for country cancer patients travelling to Adelaide for treatment.

On this 10th anniversary ride and final Mercer SuperCycle, the aim was simple: four homes and \$2.8 million raised to support people with cancer. The cyclists began their journey through Clare, and cycled to Wallaroo and Barossa Valley, then past Tailem Bend, McLaren Vale and back to Adelaide. Since inception in 2011, SuperCycle has raised over \$2.6 million to provide regional cancer patients a home away from home when in Adelaide receiving treatment through The Hospital Research Foundation Group's Under Our Roof project.

Under Our Roof provides a place of comfort for cancer patients to stay with their families while going through treatment. Thanks to the efforts over 10 years, there are two homes in Woodville West and two

Jeffery has been swapping his SA Police uniform for lycra since inception, and will, for a final time, complete the tough ride for cancer patients. "I feel incredibly privileged each year to participate in Mercer SuperCycle. I will be thinking about the 60+ patients and their families

who we've helped Australia-wide since the first two homes," Jim said. "This final seven-day journey is a great opportunity to raise funds to ensure we can help even more people and their families. It's also a

great way to support the rural towns of South Australia who've been hit hard by the COVID-19 pandemic."

Paul Flynn, Chief Executive of The Hospital Research Foundation Group said the homes helped ease the burden for cancer patients and provide stability for families during difficult times. "Thanks to the dedication from the Mercer SuperCycle riders and support crew, we can now offer two new family-style apartments which will be close to local hospitals and transport for people and their families," Paul said. "Our patients and their families are hugely grateful whenever they stay in our homes for the large spaces and sense of comfort, which really gives them the support they need to heal and manage their cancer treatment."







How do you want to be represented by Council?



Wakefield Regional Council is reviewing the composition and structure of the Council area as part of the process that ensures electors are fairly represented.

The Representation Review gives all interested people the chance to have a say on how they

want the Council structured, the number of Council Members and options for electing a Mayor.

Council has just released an Electoral Representation Options Paper that outlines a range of relevant information, including the advantages and disadvantages of the options available.

The options paper includes information about the

review process, elector distribution and ratios, comparisons with other councils and demographic trends which may impact future elector numbers, as well as alternative ward structure options.

Interested people are invited to tell us what they want to see:

Should we change the number of councillors?

Should we realign or change the number of wards – or remove them altogether?

Should we be led by a Mayor or Chairperson?

The overall aim is to benefit the community and ensure fair and equitable representation across Council.

Consultation closes 5pm on Friday 23 April 2021.



Propagating from seeds and cuttings

At the recent APS meeting a couple of our very experienced members were happy to share some tips and tricks on propagating Australian native plants.

Coral Dutschke (below) talked about Acacias including collecting the seed, preparing the seed and soil and planting



She indicated that you need to keep an eye on the Acacia plants that you wish to collect from, as the pods can be green one day, and if there is a hot north wind, they can easily turn

brown and open, shedding their seeds on the ground. Putting a paper bag over the pods is the answer to collecting these successfully.



Coral scratches the seed with a sharp knife or the use of sandpaper before placing in between layers of kitchen paper and keeping wet until they shoot, when the tiny plants can be removed with tweezers and popped into soil, covered with a fine gravel, kept in a warm place and watered regularly.
