

St. Francis of Assisi and the First Nativity Scene - St. Francis of Assisi had a special devotion to the Child Jesus, and he is credited with creating the first nativity scene on Christmas Eve of the year 1223 in a special ritual and Mass he held inside a cave in Greccio, Italy, inviting both his fellow friars and the townspeople to join in the celebration. Then he prepared a manger, and brought hay, and an ox and an ass to the place appointed. During the Mass, Francis told the Christmas story from the Bible and then delivered a sermon. He spoke to the people gathered there about the first Christmas and the miraculous impact that placing their

faith in Christ, the baby born in a simple manger in Bethlehem, could make in their lives. Francis urged people to reject hatred and embrace love, with God's help. Francis called Him "The Babe of Bethlehem" and the first Nativity Scene was created. It proved to be so popular that people in other areas soon set up living nativities to celebrate Christmas.
