BREWING IN DELAWARE

Author donates profits of book to FHRC

Historian John Medkeff Jr. became interested in Riverview Cemetery in 1996, when he began researching the history of Delaware's brewing industry. He discovered that many individuals and families connected to Wilmington's 19th and 20th century breweries, saloons, and bottling plants were buried at Riverview.

The results of his research have been published in *Brewing in Delaware*. The book details the history of brewing in the First State from the Swedish landing until the present, and will be available at Delaware book stores, breweries and online retailers. Medkeff will be signing his book at the **Blue Ball Barn at**

Alapocas Run State Park on September 5. Half of the proceeds from the book sales are being donated to Friends of Historic Riverview Cemetery, with the other half going to the Delaware Historical Society.

Medkeff has been a loyal supporter of FHRC since the group's formation; he and son Logan have volunteered to work on many cemetery projects. His great grand aunt, Lydie Logan Metcalf, and husband Aaron Millard Rice are interred at Riverview.
