Our November 12th meeting was held at the Cedar Knolls restaurant. Dr. Jerry Hinn was our speaker and as always he had a wealth of knowledge to pass on to us about the latest veterinarian procedures, heartworm treatment, and home emergency procedures.

Under new business at the meeting, I brought up a number of topics that I'd like to mention here for those of you who missed the meeting.

- 1) When I took over the Presidency, I really had no idea how to put on any of the activities that we do during the year. Russ Hammond guided me through the maze the first year, but I think one of the reasons why our members don't volunteer more often is that they have no idea how to do any of the club's jobs!
- So I have asked all of our officers and committee chairs to please write down the duties of the office or committee, the deadlines for each, the steps involved, when each should be done, and all contacts involved in getting the job done. All of the info will go into a central notebook that will be passed from President to President so that when someone is asked to do a job, a "playbook" will be available to them to make the job as easy possible.
- 2) I'd also like to see a history of the club reconstructed. Hard copies of items, such as newsletters, have been lost and computers have crashed with information on them that now may no longer be available. I am asking anyone who has past newsletters or historical information to please call me at 703-777-2277 so we can reconstruct the last 50+ years!
- 3) The profile of our members has changed over the years. We are no longer primarily a club for breeders and those who show their dogs in conformation. We have a wonderful group of people who love their Airedales as companions and want

to do activities with them. This means that not just our targeted audience at grooming sessions should change, but the location and activities of our meetings. Instead of four restaurant based meetings a year, I would like to take the meetings outdoors whenever the weather allows. That way we can have our dogs with us, which, after all, is the whole idea, right?

4) I would also like to reinstate the member roster, distributed on an annual basis. This will allow our members to locate other members who are near them.

And we are going to reinstate the Certificates of Achievement! If you have a dog that has earned any AKC title or award, such as a championship, an obedience, tracking, or therapy dog title, a CGC award, etc., please contact me with your information.

And, finally, I want suggestions from all of our members about what activities and events YOU would like to see the club present!

Picnic at Frying Pan Park September 25, 2011

The day dawned bright and sunny for the first picnic at Frying Pan Park in Fairfax County Virginia. We began with a Continental breakfast of bagels with cream cheese, donuts, coffee, orange juice and a fabulous apple cake made by new member Ginger Robinson!

A **Rally Obedience** course set up and coached by President Corally Burmaster. There was enough time for everyone to run the course at least once. Corally helped newcomers to Rally understand the signs and instructions. Rally Obedience combines some of the features of Obedience and Agility, but is easier than both. It is an easy first step into competition.

Pam McKusick and Charlie walked the course with a little coaching from Corally and had a great time. Deb and Pat Carroll, Jessica Rabin and Jeanne Esmond have been attending classes in Rally and Obedience for some time. Deb and Jessica have competed in Rally Obedience and have put Rally titles on their dogs. (The next Rally Match is December 2nd at the Catoctin Club. President Burmaster said that Airedales used to be considered a NOB (Non Obedience Breed). Willa and Jessica Rabin not only compete in Rally, Willa is a trained Hearing Assistance dog. Deb and Sandi also compete in Rally and Sandi has completed her training to be a therapy dog. It is gratifying to see Airedales returning to their roots as excellent working dogs.

Following the Rally walk though, Corally gave a demonstration in **TEACHING TRICKS**. Corally and Nicky demonstrated the steps to teach the Roll Over using a lure of food and the clicker. It's easier than you might think.

Step one – Get the dog to lie down on its side. Step two – Get out your treat and lure the dogs head

towards the rump.

Step three- When the dog's head moves towards the rump, click and treat

Step four- Repeat.

Each time the dog's head should move a bit further to his side, finally moving across the rump away from the feet to the opposite side and BINGO the dog rolls over. I tried this with my dog, Sandy, and it took about 5 minutes to get him to roll over to his and my surprise!

Next came a brief meeting featuring the election of new officers followed by a pot luck luncheon.

Our program was a demonstration by Pam Wanveer of **Tellington Touch TTouch.** T Touch is s series of circular motions, slides and rubs that calm and heal. Ms Wanveer explained how various wraps (including the Thunder shirt) and harnesses can contribute to the calming aspect of T Touch.

Minutes of September 25, 2011 Meeting

The Airedale Terrier Club of Metropolitan Washington (ATCMW) met at Frying Pan Park in Northern Virginia at 10:00AM for dog activities. Ann Riley and Corally Burmaster demonstrated tricks that could be performed by dogs at all levels of training.

Club President Corally Burmaster called the meeting to order at 12:45 after the ATCMW picnic. Minutes of the previous meeting were provided in the Newsletter. Copies of the Treasurer's Report were available on the tables at the site.

Pam McKusick reported no rescued dogs at this time, but there is a need for long term foster care. The National Airedale rescue is still selling tickets to the quilt that is raffled off annually. Member Jeanne Esmond assists each year in the making of the beautiful quilts depicting Airedales. Details to purchase tickets are available online, and link sent to members.

Corally announced that December 3 will be the date for the Scottish Walk Parade in Alexandria. On behalf of the Airedale Club we have requested placement away from firing guns in the lineup for the parade.

Airedale Terrier Club of Metropolitan Washington Minutes of November 12, 2011 Meeting

The Airedale Terrier Club of Metropolitan Washington (ATCMW) met at the Cedar Knoll Inn, Alexandria, Virginia. Luncheon was served at 12:30. During the luncheon, Dr. Jerry Hinn, DVM, was introduced as the speaker. He brought to the attention of the Club membership the subjects of salmonella in pet foods, hypoallergenic problems and medications available in treating the medical needs of dogs.

Jim Hession conducted the raffle with Club President Corally Burmaster selecting the winning tickets. First winner was Dr. Jerry Hinn; second basket was won by Marie Hammond and third basket winner was Margie Goodyear.

At 2:00 Corally Burmaster called the meeting to order. She announced that minutes of the previous meeting would be provided in the Newsletter. A copy of the Treasurer's Report was posted. She announced the Frying Pan Park meeting had 35 members and guests. She suggested the club might alternate our picnic meetings between Maryland and Virginia, given our membership is represented in both states.

Club President Burmaster brought to the attention of Club members that the registration of our Articles of Incorporation in the State of Maryland had been allowed to lapse. These are necessary in order to

do business as a legal entitiy. Attorney David Taylor has been valuable in assisting in the process to regain the status held by the Club.

Pam McKusick, Rescue Chairman, announced she and Jeanne Esmond had gone to Montgomery with limited monetary success. Airedale Square netted a total of \$496 with purchases and donations. For the Scottish Walk, scheduled for 3 December in Alexandria, VA, Pam McKusick announced a new banner with the Club Logo would be used in the Parade.

Our Specialty judges will be Margo Dupre for Sweepstakes and Lee Stevens for regular classes. Russ Hammond will handle the designated trophies, and Corally will handle the catalog ads.

Airedale Square was very successful and appreciation given to Nora Dudman, who in turn thanked the members for their support.

Corally announced that the Membership Chairman is Deb Carroll. Scottish Walk Chairman is Susan Crawford. The Newsletter will provide a web link to the details of the Scottish Walk. Corally

provided ATCMW business cards which were made available as hand outs for members to introduce potential Airedale owners to the Club. Patrick Broom maintains our club website.

It was announced that additional orders for two Airedale books were required to order the basic order of 16. Two more books were ordered by Tarry Faries. Given that we now have orders for 16 books, Margie Goodyear will pay for 16 books coming from Sweden to be distributed at the next meeting after the books arrive.

Corally requested that Club Officers list the duties for which they are responsible and submit these to Corally as a blueprint to pass on to future office holders. The information should contain the duties, deadlines and steps required to perform the duties, plus points of contact to complete the duties. It was suggested duties be rotated with the exception of Rescue and the Newsletter. The Club needs to put together a club history, including the founding which included Jim McLynn, Joan Andrew and Lou Swafford. The Club Historian should put this project together. Corally also mentioned that the Club needs to adjust the activities of the club to fit the membership profile. The majority of the club members are not dog breeders, but are interested in the companionship of Airedales. Activities such as grooming sessions might need to be changed to reflect the season, i.e., late Spring and late Autumn. Future plans include reinstating the Club Roster and Certificates of Achievements in recognition of awards or titles awarded to the Airedales.

At 2:55, a motion to adjourn was made by Franklin Goodyear, seconded by Marie Hammond, The motion passed.
