We require all buyers to have their dog, once it is two years of age, tested for the various <b>genetic diseases</b> that Great Danes are susceptible to, including OFA x-rays for hip and elbow dysplasia, and examinations by a board-certified veterinary cardiologist and ophthalmologist for eye and heart problems. These tests can cost upwards of \$700, depending upon your area.
Will you ensure that your dog has this testing done between 24 and 30 months of age?

Do you understand that our warranty is contingent upon the completion of this testing by 30 months of age?

We also ask each owner to participate in the University of Pennsylvania's Canine Behavioral Assessment Research Questionnaire C-BARQ ( <a href="http://vetapps.vet.upenn.edu/cbarq/">http://vetapps.vet.upenn.edu/cbarq/</a> ) at a minimum of 1 and 4 years of age.
