Center for Spiritual Living St. George is very happy to welcome Rev. Joe Kovach as our new Senior Minister. Joe was a guest speaker for us even before Rev. Laura arrived. He has spoken regularly for our Sunday services during the two-plus years since we began online-only services. He is not a stranger to us, but it is time to get to know Joe in a whole new way. As our spiritual leader, he is now one of us and will be leading us to greater heights as a CSL Center and as individuals seeking to live an even more spiritually-focused life.

Joe grew up in Kenmore, NY, a small suburb of Buffalo. Born in 1970 makes him the age of the

children of some of us. After high school, Joe chose to enroll in a psychology program at Buffalo State College. He wasn't planning on going to college initially, but when his parents discovered that intention, during a dinner conversation in late spring of his senior year, he was given an ultimatum: "Go to college or to go out and support himself!"

Joe feels he did not truly apply himself the first semester, but did obtain a bachelor's degree in psychology. His mom was a stay-at-home-mom for most of his childhood and his dad was an electrician/electrical designer.

As a new college graduate with a degree in psychology, Joe found no jobs he wanted or that wanted him. He got his first break in an independent school as a teacher's aide. The school served a difficult population -the "worst of-the-worst-behaved" kids that had IEP's Individual (special education Education Programs). found himself Joe physically restraining students on a daily basis. As we can imagine, this took an emotional toll on him. He vowed, "Never again!"

During his second year, Joe chose to listen to the children differently and noticed that students benefited from meeting with one particular counselor at the school, who became his inspiration for his future career. Because of this counselor and the struggles he had in school himself, Joe went to Canisius College where he earned a master's degree in educational/agency counseling. "Counseling lit me up," states Joe, "and I began living from a place of purpose." He was hired by the Clark County School District, one of the nation's largest districts, in 1998 and moved to Las Vegas, Nevada. He was joined out west by his sister and brother-in-law, both teachers, and eventually his parents.







This village will consist of replicas of major buildings important to the American Revolution, including Liberty Hall from Philadelphia, Washington's Mount Vernon and others that will be used to educate students about the Constitution and the formation of the United States.
