From the Pastor's Desk

Greetings in the Name of Christ!

Ash Wednesday was February 26th. Historically, many folks give up something for the Lenten season as a way of making time in their schedule and/or focusing their attention on drawing closer to God. I challenge you this year not only to give up, but to take up something. If you are giving up sweets or candy, then also put aside the money you would spend on the candy or sweets and donate the money to help someone else or a charity close to your heart. The same goes whatever else you are giving up: drinking, overeating, buying new clothes or other non-essentials, etc. Whatever you give up for the Lenten season, share the money you save with a charity or person/family in need. If you are still undecided on what you will be doing this Lenten season to make this season mindful of Jesus' journey towards the cross, I suggest taking something up. If you do not read the Bible or a Spiritual Devotional book, then put aside a time daily to do so. The Upper Room Daily Devotional is a good place to start. It is a small book with only one page assigned each day for reading, which also includes a scripture to go along with the reading. Copies are in the church front hall and in the fellowship hall. If you haven't been to church lately, choose to mark the Lenten season by doing so. Another Lenten practice might be sharing. Share your time and go visit someone you haven't seen in a while. Prepare double the recipe of a meal and bring the meal to another to make life easier for them. Sign up to

host a fellowship hour at church following worship or speak with Rita Spencer or Karen Anable on how you might assist with our *Wonderful Wednesday Worship* in preparing or serving the light lunch.

Fellowship has added a game night held on the last Friday of each month. It is a time to share laughter and fun as we deepen our knowledge of one another and create memories of our church family. Come join us.

The Missions Committee will host a *Baked Potato* Potluck Dinner followed by a Talentless/Talent Show on March 28th at 5:30pm. The committee will provide the potatoes and you are invited to bring in a creative topping to share with others for the potatoes. (Ideas: chili, sour cream and chives, bacon, veggies and cheese sauce, etc.). A talentless/talent show will follow. This means you do not need to be a professional to have an act. We are seeking singers, musicians, dramatists, poets, tap dancers, karate demo, skits, comedians, or whatever you can share in good Christian fun to have some fellowship. We will have a free will offering to support One Great Hour of Sharing for both UCC and UMC denominations. Sign up in the fellowship hall of what you are bringing for the potato share and what talent you might offer. Of course, we also need an audience so don't feel you have to perform in the talent part.

Our Lenten worship series will focus on risks: Risking Reputation, Risking Righteous Anger, Risking Challenge, Risking Rejection, Risking Loss of Friends, and Resisting Temptation. The series is based on the book, Entering the Passion of Jesus by Amy Jill Levine, a favorite scholar of the Wednesday study group. As we look at Jesus' journey through Passion Week, you are invited not to look at the story as history, but to find yourself in each scene. We will have picture frames around the church to take pictures and use during worship. If you participate in missions, please capture the moment and send a copy to the office so we can use it during worship. May you move closer to God through this journey with Jesus to the cross.



As United Methodists, we accept and affirm that the primary task of our church is to make disciples for Jesus Christ, to proclaim the Gospel and good news, and to seek, welcome and gather people of faith into the body of Christ. When one joins a United Methodist congregation, one becomes a member of the total United Methodist connection. And when you join the journey of united Methodism, you help make mission and ministry possible!

Each congregation in the United Methodist system is expected to pay mission shares. When people give to the local church, a portion of your gift goes toward these mission shares, which help in a variety of ways. For example, when you give, a portion of your money helps with the development and maintenance of our church camps in the New England Annual Conference. Our Mission Shares help underwrite a variety of youth ministries, camp workshops, and training events. You provide Schools of Christian Mission and spiritual growth for your church members. You fund professional counseling for pastors and/or their families when needed. You supply a campus ministry and Christian presence through United Methodist in Higher Education at Boston University and other colleges throughout the conference. You champion over 1,000 missionaries around the world and in our own country. You endow more than 10,000 mission projects around the world. You support 13 United Methodists seminaries as they train future pastors and other church leaders. You help sustain 11 predominately Black colleges as they equip a new generation of leaders. You strengthen the vital work of United Methodist-related hospitals, homes for the aged, and community centers around the world and in our own country.

Your Mission Shares help distribute Bibles throughout the world. You help support UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) which maintains a network to channel relief and aid to disaster victims around the world and in our own country. United Methodists are building new congregations across the world. Your Mission Shares provide ongoing support for the Red Bird Mission in Kentucky, and much, much more!
