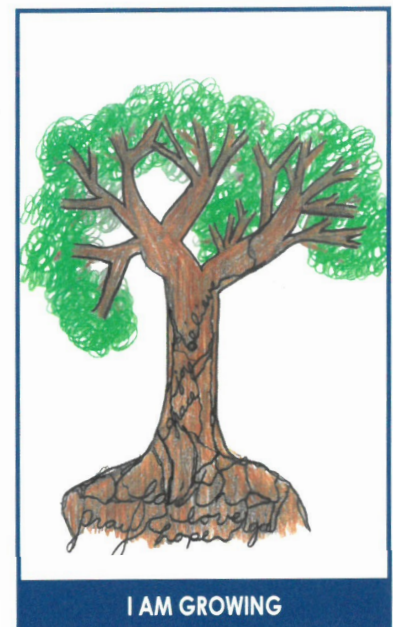

Word from Our Pastor

"I am the way and the truth and the life, no one comes to the Father except through me." John 14:6

Dear Trinity Family and Friends,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the one who grants us true peace, Jesus Christ Our Lord, amen.

Well, we've hit the heat of summer! Yesterday my thermometer outside my back door hit 120+ degrees! Folks, that's hot! I hope you are all finding ways to stay cool until we get back to the days when we complain about how cold it is... It does seem like we're people who are never really satisfied with what we get.



If that statement is true about the weather, it's even more true when it comes to religion and our God. Humans always seem to be looking over the fence and noticing how green the grass looks on the other side. During the Christian Passover Seder Meal which we celebrated on Maundy Thursday this past April, those of us who attended that event recited the words of an ancient Hebrew song entitled Dayenu. The word Dayenu means in Hebrew, "It is Enough". The song recalls the great kindness with which the Lord God deals with us. The verses tell the story of God bringing the Hebrew people out of slavery in Egypt, how God parted the Red Sea and led the people through the wilderness for 40 years, feeding them with Manna from Heaven, doves for meat, and water from a rock. It tells of the time when God gave the people a Law, written in stone. After each verse the congregation responds Dayenu! It would have been enough...

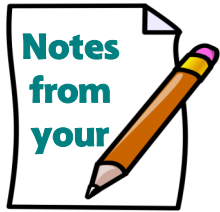


When is enough, enough for us? During the month of July, we celebrate our freedom on Independence Day. I wonder what that freedom means for us. Sometimes I think of freedom like a four-wheeler going off the road and making my own path. On that four-wheeler I can go anywhere I want. Is that all freedom is? Sometimes I think it's like being in a grocery store before the Pandemic, when the shelves were full, and our pockets weren't so empty. We had freedom to buy whatever we needed and some of the things we wanted. Is freedom all about wanton gluttony and rabid consumerism? Certainly, freedom is about the freedom to think and live our lives as we want, but it does have its limits. "... and justice for all" our Pledge of Allegiance proclaims, but sometimes I must curtail my freedom, so I don't trample on yours.

When it comes to freedom of religion, we once again have so many choices. It's almost like the store shelves have been resupplied with no supply chain troubles. According to Google there are more than 45,000 Christian denominations around the world. That doesn't even include other religions such as Islam, Buddhism, or Hinduism. A week or so ago I heard a preacher proclaim that all religions lead to God. I was aghast! What happened to the saying of Jesus that no one comes to the Father, that's God, except through Him? As I thought about what that pastor was trying to say, it occurred to me that he was bowing to the altar of inclusion. It was more important for that preacher to include all humanity under one god than to follow the clear teaching of the God who actually became human and lived among us. In essence, he was saying Jesus isn't enough. There must be more. Maybe the roughly 900 million Hindu people are part of God's flock as well. I don't know how God will deal with the Buddhists, Hindus, or Muslims. What I can say for certain is that God has promised those who follow Jesus Christ, who trust Jesus and the promises He made above all else, will be saved. Jesus also said those who trust in the Son of God will be free. As we celebrate our Freedom this month, may we remember our freedom comes from and through Jesus Christ. If the Son sets you free, you are free indeed! Amen!

Decluttering Checklist Method

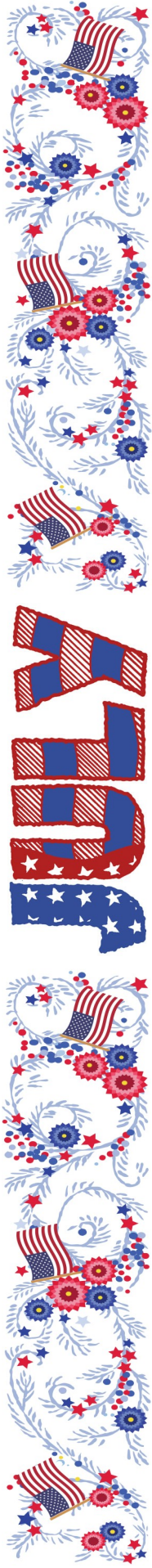

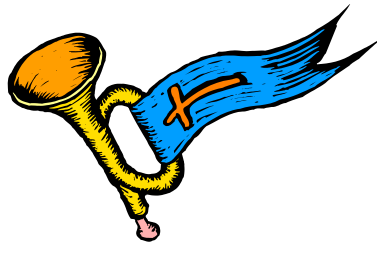
