The consistory encourages you to be part of the conversation; this evening will offer opportunities for asking questions and participation in round table discussions. **We hope to see you there.**









Celebrating!


For the LORD is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations.

SINNERS IN GOD'S CHURCH


"To live above with saints we love, wouldn't that be glory? To live below with saints we know, well that's a different story." This is an Irish rhyme I recently read in a devotional I use every morning. As we at Cornerstone look to a new shepherd coming in to lead us, Pastor Scott Van Voorst, we as a church are all beset with problems relating to belief and behavior. But we all sin because we are sinners and we all fail as sinners to forgive the offender, despite his genuine repentance. We hope and pray this new leader will come to love Cornerstone and never give up on us.

Many of us have experienced difficult times in our churches and may even be the cause of "excessive sorrow" as Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 2:7-8. "Now instead you ought to forgive and comfort him, so that he will not be overwhelmed by excessive sorrow. I urge you, therefore, to reaffirm your love for him."

We have all known of people in the church who

have become wearied, hurt and even used by unreasonable demands of those who even well intentioned see what we have done as accusatory. It is tempting to just withdraw and not attend services, bible study or just interaction with brothers/sisters in Christ who have hurt us. Yet this is not the Christ-centered model Paul gives us.

As a response to God's word let us reconnect with God's people. If you know of someone who has turned their backs on the church and its people, encourage them to return. "If you find a perfect church don't join it, as you will only spoil it." Another quote from this devotional. Be part of the solution, rather than part of the problem as the saying goes. We need to thank our pastors and fellow Christians who faithfully walk beside us when we sin against each other. Forgive as you have been forgiven and come back to your brothers/sisters in Christ.


