

People interested in the beaches around the Venice area got an opportunity to learn more about shells and how to use them for artistic creations at a recent festival in Venice, thanks to members of the Sarasota Shell Club (SSC). The club was asked to participate in the Venice Museum & Archives' "Making Waves: Venice Area Beaches Then and Now" that was held on March 21 at the museum's complex on the island of Venice.

Activity at the club's tent was non-stop for the three-hour event. Bruce and Karen Paulsen used Ron Bopp's display to explain the various types of shells that were picked up on beaches along Southwest Florida and about the club's many activities.

Donna Bartels used various shells to make flowers, much to the amazement of both young and old, and gave away the



flowers she made during her demonstrations.

Angela Sampogna was a hit with the kids, who learned about shells, decorated



various kinds of shells, and enjoyed coloring activities. Rae Potter described to visitors the various items for sale made from shells.

Other activities at the festival included Mote Marine's mobile aquarium and their turtle watch exhibit, hula hoop demonstrations, Venice Jetty skim board demonstrations, Spanish Point exhibit, and a performance by the Nokomis drum circle.

"I wanted to thank you and your SSC members again for coming out last Saturday for our event. We had 350+ people and it was a great success thanks to your support. I hope we can partner again in the future," wrote Michelle Harm, Curator of the Venice Museum & Archives.

President Sally Peppitoni opened the meeting at 7p.m. The meeting was held at the Waldemere Fire House with 38 members present. Sally introduced Joyce Matthys from Sanibel Island who presented a show on Nudibranchs. A very interesting and colorful show.

Sally reported that we will be having our end of the season party at the White Sands Cabana Club the same location as last year. The date is May 2nd, time 12noon to 7p.m. The get together will be a catered barbeque, requesting each club member to pay \$5.00 for the meal. Please bring your own beverages.

Ron Bopp moved that we accept the January Club minutes as included in the Beauii, a second by Angela Sampogna. Motion unanimously carried and the minutes were filed.

Sally gave a report on the 2015 Shell Show. She stated the attendance was lower on Sunday than in previous years. She read a thank you note from Alan Getttleman, one of the judges, which noted his appreciation of our show and how well they are treated. The Board voted to change the 2016 show to Thursday thru Saturday.

Linda Greiner introduced a book from the library by Jan McSween a former shell club member. It showcases her travels to Florida and becoming a Floridian in a humorous style.

Duane Kaufman, Historian reported in 1965, 16 members attended the meeting and they had a discussion on the shell show. In 1990 one of the meeting minutes noted there would be no treasurer's report because of the treasurer cutting his hand.

Lynn Gaulin, Membership, reported she had 20 new members join since the show bringing the membership to 165. Lynn will be stepping down from her position and is looking forward to just be able to attend a meeting without duties.

Sally reviewed the field trips that have been planned. She noted that the trip to Kice Island is still in the planning stages trying to find a boat with reasonable pricing.

Bruce Paulsen spoke about the Web page and Facebook page are both getting good responses.

Peggy Williams reported that currently there are no more education classes set up. If anyone has anything they would like to have taught please talk with her.

Sunshine Committee – Reported sending healing messages to members Melissa Heron, Mel Elwood and Sandy Johnson.

Artisans Group – Nancy Marini reported new members were welcomed into the group. The group will be sending some items and also do demos for adults and children at the Venice Museum on March 28th.

Roseann Roble reported that the Bird Key Yacht Club has invited the Club to put up a display about shells both scientific and artistic. Roseann will confirm with size of the display and location we will have.

OLD BUSINESS

Sally P. reviewed the idea of the club holding a fund raising dinner and dance. The idea was presented to the general membership for a vote, which indicated NO show of hands for support.

NEW BUSINESS

Nominating Committee – Angela Sampogna reported there would be a general election of officers and board members at the April Meeting. A full slate of offices was presented, the committee will also be taking nominations from the floor the night of the meeting.

Angela also reported about her success at the shell show, educating 42 children. She received a donation of shells to be used for the Children's corner for upcoming events.

Sally announced that Fran Schlusemann was voted in by the Board to receive a lifetime membership to the Club.

Nancy Marini announced that the Holiday party December 5, 2015 will be a luncheon to accommodate those who prefer to only travel in daylight.

Sally showed a sample of our new Donation Receipt and all in one Thank You to be used when a donation is received. This will allow the club to be accountable for any donations that have a monetary value and help assure the donor is thanked and receives a receipt.

50 Years Ago



Sixteen members and guests attended the March 14, 1965 meeting of the Sarasota Shell Club. A balance of \$168.46 was in the Club

treasury.

Much of the meeting pertained to the shell show.

- 1. "Apparent friction" with the venue manager was resolved after a "very nice discussion."
- 2. It was decided to drape the tables so things could be stored underneath.
- 3. Mrs. Oberle was paid \$15 dollars for 12 shells to serve as door prizes. This was deemed a "real bargain" since a *Junonia* and large *Oliva* were included in the 12.
- 4. It was unanimously agreed to pay all the judges expenses including "meals and bridge tolls."
- 5. Members bagged and priced shells to be sold at the show.

25 Years Ago

The regular meeting of SSC was held on March 8, 1990.

There was no treasurer's report as the treasurer had "cut her hand badly."

Peggy Williams reported that the new facility on Sanibel Island would be named the Bailey-Mathews Museum.

Field trips to the home of Vi Hertweck (to view her collection) and to Pine Island were announced.

Mary Weare gave the educational program on carrier shells. LaVerne Niere gave the program on Panama.

The COA convention is hosted by the Broward Shell Club, which has members from Palm Beach County to Miami. It will be in Weston, Florida at the Bonaventure Resort & Spa. Field trips include snorkeling, land snailing and an Everglades airboat ride. Dates are July 14-19. There are wonderful programs in prospect, like going to a dozen shell club meetings in three days! At the end of the convention is a free-to-anyone "Dealers' Bourse", sales of absolutely astonishing shells.
