





Cheri started the meeting with a prayer.

"Old"/ongoing business & projects:

Noisy bucket collection (for Mujilla Falls agriculture center in Zambia) is ongoing. Giving has improved with in-person worship. Bucket will remain at the back of the sanctuary for weekly giving.

Ingathering collection for Annual Conference- Thanks to those who set up the collection area. Will continue to remind the congregation of the project. Full kits or specific items may be donated. See the table in the fellowship area for information. Items collected will be taken to Eau Claire Lake St. UMC in early June.

School supply collection is on hold pending further information from the school.

Food pantry collection going well. Suggestion was made to maybe give our collection a "new name" to help promote interest (such as "Fill the kitchen/pantry cupboards",etc).

New business:

Discussed our Wisconsin UMC camps & how we can promote attendance. There are scholarships available from the conference, as well as from our church. We will be posting some information, but all conference information & registration is online this year (wiumcamps.org). Camps are available for youth, adults and families.

Special Sundays and when to hold them. Native American Sunday will be moved to the summer. Plans in progress to contact the leader at Odanah to schedule him to speak. Peace with Justice is usually held the first Sunday after Pentecost, which would be May 30th this year. The group agreed that this date would work for our April-June quarter special Sunday. (*Note- date later changed at Ad Board)

Other discussion included how often our committee needs to meet. In the past this committee met every other month. With the numerous projects in progress, we agreed to meet again in May and revisit this item.

Cheri mentioned a short video shown during the Bishop's Convocation of Laity Leadership (held in March). The video was of Mujilla Falls Agriculture Center and the new missionary, Temba Nkomozepi, who took Paul Webster's position. The group felt they would like the congregation to see this to show how our support helps them. Cheri will check on this.

The Ingathering for 2021 is underway. Annual Conference, June 18 -19 will be virtual again this year. The process for Ingathering will be like the Ingathering held last fall. In each District several churches have agreed to be **drop-off sites**. Several churches will be both **drop-off and pick-up sites**. Gathered supplies can be dropped off at the **drop-off sites** from Monday, June 14th – Monday, June 21st. **Drop-off sites** must transfer all gathered supplies to a **pick-up site** by Tuesday, June 22nd. The Midwest Mission Distribution Center(MMDC) truck will be in Wisconsin on Wednesday, June 23rd to pick up all the gathered supplies. MMDC will contact the pick-up site to indicate their time of arrival.

All churches are encouraged to begin gathering the supplies for <u>Personal Dignity Kits</u> and <u>Homecare Kits</u>. The list of supplies needed for those kits will be found elsewhere in this message. Items can be put together in kit form as indicated, or they can be donated separately. Monetary donations can also be made and given to the host site. Make checks out to the <u>Midwest Mission Distribution Center</u>.

If MMDC needs additional supplies, a notice of such will appear in the E-news and on the Wisconsin Annual Conference web page/missions.

You may use the drop-site that is closest to your location. All five district have drop-off sites and request that you call in advance before delivering supplies. The contact information is included with the site location.
