MARCH 2021 - THE END OF AN ERA



Do you remember February 1999? Liverpool were 6th in the Premiership, Everton scored 5 at home against Middlesbrough and there was growing concern over another potentially lethal virus: The Millennium Bug (aka Y2K).

In late January, St James newsletter had advertised a vacant job in a local church setting. One of the congregation thought '*that sounds interesting but I've already got a job*'. Then without warning, things changed and so an 11th-hour application for the church job was submitted. The wheels

of the appointment process turned, drawing our own LYNNE BARKER into service with the Mersey Synod of the United Reformed Church, in an admin role that evolved over time into Office Manager and Moderator's PA. She answered the call joyfully and loyally, continuing to do so for the last 22 years, and is now preparing to retire on March 31st.



By coincidence, Lynne will end this time in the same way she began - working in a different setting from the Synod's main office.

The early months were spent with a small team of comparative strangers and a single computer in a portacabin in a Birkenhead church car park. Eventually, the new office at St Stephens Church, Wavertree was finished and became her 'working home' until, in this final year, Lynne, like so many others, has found herself working-from-home for real. This time, there have been established relationships and no shortage of technology to keep everyone together and in touch, but if it was a challenging way to begin, it must also be a challenging way to end.


And in between? We might guess that Lynne's job description began '*Look after the office*' and ended '*any other tasks that are appropriate and necessary*'. So routine duties often embraced people calling in, for no obvious reason other than the need to talk, and Lynne listened, leading to many shared special moments, openings to build networks between denominations, churches and people, and countless times and ways to show loving Christian witness in the workplace.

Like many church families across the Mersey Region, St James has benefited from having Lynne in the Synod Office; someone close who recognises change happens and the positive aspects of new ideas, who tackles everything with thoughtful enthusiasm and who has carefully shared available information to help horizons stay wide, encourage shared working at many levels, and - especially here in Woolton - strengthen our practical approach to being an LEP.

Over recent weeks, many of Lynne's colleagues have been expressing their regret at her retirement, and their thanks for all her work and friendship since 1999. As a church family here at St James, we give thanks too, and wish her a long, healthy and happy retirement, full of God's blessings, and with lots of time to enjoy the love of Roy and the family.

We do so, hoping that, with them, we too may continue to enjoy Lynne's friendship and fellowship in the days to come.






