# SIDE SEAM LEGGINGS of the SOUTHERN WOODLANDS &

TALL LEGGINGS SHOULD FIT TIGHTLY AROUND THE LEG

WOOL LEGGINGS CAN BE WORN FOR DRESS-UP OCCASIONS OR FOR CASUAL USE. LOOK FOR A HIGH QUALITY, HARD FINISH, TIGHTLY WOVEN WOOL BROADCLOTH.

RED, NAVY& BLACK ARE THE MOST

COMMON COLORS. FOLLOWED BY WHITE BROWN& GREEN. BELT TIES CAN BE MADE FROM SCRAP WOOL. THEY NEED TO BE AT LEAST TWO FEET LONG. DO ALL STITCHING BY HAND. IF POSSIBLE USE THE BIAS EDGE OF THE WOOL FOR THE TOP. LEGGINGS SHOULD MEASURE FROM MID-THIGH TO JUST BELOW

THE ANKLE.

SILK RIBBON CAN BE APPLIED TO BIND& CLOSE THE RAWEDGE. ONE OPTION IS TO USE ONE COLOR RIBBON ON THE OUT-SIDE AND ANOTHER INSIDE THE FLAPS. RIBBONCOLORS: GOLD, SCARLET, GREEN, CRIMSON PURPLE. CLOSE THE RAWEDGE. ONE OPTION IS

HIGHQUALITY WOOL BROAD CLOTH, LINEN-SILK OF COTTON THREAD, SCISSORS, CHALK, NEEDLES, BEE'S WAX, EDGE RIBBON -

BEFORE TRADE WOOL MOST

LEGGINGS WERE OF SMOKED BRAIN-TAN or BARK-TAN BUCK-THE LEGGING SKIN, USUALLY DEER. SOME BELT ALSO HOLDS THE WERE DYED BLACK, RED . BROWN. NON-SMOKED PREECHCLOUT "WHITE" HIDES WERE WORN FOR CEREMONIES BY MEDICINE MEN. THE "FORK" ATTACHMENTOF THE BELT TIES 15 UNIQUE IN THE SOUTH. USE A BUCKSKIN THONG OR HEAVY LINEN CORD FOR

STITCHING, WHEN

NOT IN USE, ROLL

YOUR LEGGINGS

FROM THE BOTTOM

UP. GARTERS OR TIES


ARE WORN WITH BOTH

A FRINGED EDGE IS MORE COMMON IN THE SOUTH. AFTER THE STITCHING IS COMPLETE CUTTHE SIDE FRINGE 1 INCH LONG CLOSE TO THE STITCH. SIDE FRINGE CAN VARY FROM 1/8 TO 1/4 INCH. BOTTOM FRINGE IS 1/8 INCH.
