MYSTERIOUS VETERAN

After approximately 35 years hanging on the side fence of Richard & Beth Farrell's home, it has been identified as a Lacoste et Battmann of around 1905. The few identifying features were: The distinctive dumb irons, the angle iron flitch plate chassis and the gear change. Unfortuneately this is all that remains of this unique little veteran. This french company made vehicles from 1897 until 1913 Only some of them were marketed under their own name, for a couple of years from 1905 to 1907. All others were sold under the name of agents or other manufacturers supplied with LeB components. The following makes are reported to have LeB components Napoleon,Regal,Gamage,Speedwell,Cupelle,Lacoste et Battman, Lacoba,Horse shoe,Jackcon and lastly Simplica in 1910-13. Several motors from differentt makers were used, probably french, but in 1905 would mostly likely have been a 1 or 2 cylinder De Dion Bouton. The bronze gearboxes would have been unlikely to have survived the scrap metal dealers along with radiators and lights.

This chassis was previously owned by Norm Griffey having come from a neighbouring property owned by August Berndt before being acquired by Richard Farrell. I am keen to know any previous history of this car which is fairly rare and more importantly acquire any remaining parts. Presumably it came to the Inverell district in the early 1900s. Bottom photo is of a 1905 Cupelle from LeB components.


