BACKGROUND AND HISTORY

Crossing the Hermeneutical Bridges

Reputation

- Youngest of all seven cities
- Founded in 140 B.C. by colonists from Pergamum under the reign of Attalus II
- "One who loves his brother"
 - Attalus and Eumenes

Reputation

- Story of King Xerxes
 - On his way to invade Europe and found shelter under a great plane tree
 - Left costly gifts on the tree
 - Left a bodyguard to care for the tree

Reputation

- AD 17 destroyed by the same earthquake that destroyed Sardis
- Tremors continued on for years
 Described as a city full of earthquakes

Reputation

- Rebuilt by Tiberius
 Money and remittance of taxes for 5yrs
- Renamed their city, "Neocaesarea"
- Renamed again to "Flavia" in honor of Emperor Vespasian whose family name was "Flavia"

Reputation


- During the rise of Mohammed and the Turks, only city that did not fall.
- Known as the "last bastion of Christianity"
- Later fell to the Turks in the 14th Century

Setting


- 28 miles south of Sardis
- Stood at the border of 3 countries
 Myasia, Lydia, Phrygia
- Gateway to the East highway from Europe to the East

Setting

- Located on the great plain,
 "Katakekaumene" "burned land"
- A volcanic plain with lava beds and the ashes of extinct volcanoes







Economy

- On a very fertile plain due to volcanoes
- Center of a grape growing industry
 - World famous producers of wine

Economy

- There were many hot springs believed to be medicinal
 - Attracted many who would bathe in the springs in search of health
 - Still a place of hot springs and tourists

Economy

- Became rich because of its position on the highway from Europe to the East
- It was a difficult place to live because of the earthquakes and tremors
 - Most lived outside of the city and commuted in
 - Those who stayed were considered mad

Politics

- Its purpose was to bring Greek culture to the surrounding areas
 - Particularly Lydia and Phrygia
- It was a missionary city of Greek culture to the Barbarians

Politics

- They were highly successful
 - The Lydians soon lost their own culture and language and even willingly became part of the Roman Empire
 - The Phrygians refused Hellenization

Religion

- Was often called, "little Athens" because of its many gods and temples
- Dionysius was their main god
 god of grapes
- There was a synagogue for the large Jewish population

Religion

- A custom in Philadelphia:
 - A pillar in the temple of the gods with their name on it was erected for prominent and noble people who left large sums of money to the state or temple

Christianity

- A strong and faithful church
- Some persecution which came mostly from the Jews

Today

- The church remains
- Modern city of Alasheher
 - Main industry is licorice production

The Message of Jesus

Person of Jesus

- Holy term used only for God
 Called "the Holy One of God" Jn 6:69
- True "the genuine One" or "real One"
 The Jews claimed that Jesus was a liar
 - and not the Messiah – Jesus is the true God, not all the "gods" of Philadelphia

Person of Jesus

- Holds the key of David His absolute authority for entrance into the Messianic Kingdom
- Rev 1:18
- See Isa 22:15-25

Person of Jesus

- Holds the key of David
 - What He opens no one can shut and what he shuts no one can open
 - He has ultimate authority as to what will be and what will not be

Praise from Jesus

- I know your deeds complete and good
- Kept His word and not denied His name
 Not given in to persecution or false
 - teaching
- They have an open door from Jesus that cannot be shut

Praise from Jesus

- Question: What is the open door?
- Answer: The missionary ventures to promote and proclaim the gospel
 - Purpose of Philadelphia was to Hellenize
 - Purpose of the church is to evangelize

Encouragement from Jesus

- Their persecutors will fall at the feet of the church and proclaim that Jesus is the truth and Christians are right
- He will keep them from the trial that is coming upon the whole earth

Encouragement from Jesus

- Question: what does this mean? To be kept from the trial that is coming?
- We are clearly speaking about the Great Tribulation
- See Jn 17:15; Rev 6:9-11

Promise from Jesus

- I am coming soon
- To those who overcome the world will become a pillar in the temple of God
 - Never will he/she leave God's presence

Promise from Jesus

- Will be marked with the name of God
- Will be marked with the name of the city of God
- Will be marked with the new name of Jesus
- Rev 7:3; 14:1

Rebuke from Jesus

■ None!

Just like Smyrna
