Is it easy to BELIEVE? Is it wrong to DOUBT?

Belief comes easy to some – this may be true where there is a strong 'faith community' which is supportive. For many faith is an act made in the face of doubt and undertainty. St. Thomas may be our favourite Saint because there is something of the 'doubting' Thomas in most of us. Many baptised Christians feel guilty if they have doubts but, like Thomas, it is probably best to admit to them, and through prayer and outside help work through them – always being open to the power of God working in us through the Holy Spirit. It is not failure to admit that we need help. The Gospel we listen to this weekend at Mass gives reassurance and also reminds us that doubt was present right from the beginning of the Church – even in the closest friends of Jesus himself. The Apostles had to come to faith in stages, always being helped by Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Faith will always involve a risk and an act of trust. Thomas can be our role model – he did not hesitate to express his doubts by outlining his 'conditions', which, if not met, he would *refuse to believe*. His honesty about his doubts led him to have *profound*, *unshakeable*, *faith*. Jesus gave him a second chance and Thomas was able to profess his faith in the addressing Jesus as "My Lord and my God". We too, who have not seen can yet believe in the risen Christ and be numbered amongst the 'blessed'.

In his Urbi et Orbi blessing on April 4, Pope Francis said the witnesses of Christ's resurrection "report an important detail: the risen Jesus bears the marks of the wounds in his hands, feet and side." "These wounds are the everlasting seal of his love for us," Francis said. "All those who experience a painful trial in body or spirit can find refuge in these wounds and, through them, receive the grace of the hope that does not disappoint." "Amid the many hardships we are enduring, let us never forget that we have been healed by the wounds of Christ," The Pope added: "In the light of the Risen Lord, our sufferings are now transfigured. Where there was death, now there is life. Where there was mourning, now there is consolation. In embracing the cross, Jesus bestowed meaning on our sufferings and now we pray that the benefits of that healing will spread throughout the world."
