

The Confluence Site (aka the “Blue Man” Site)

The Confluence site is located above the confluence of the Virgin River and the Fort Pierce Wash. The site is threatened because it is surrounded by development and is at the back end of one of the view undeveloped lots in the area.

The site is a small one, consisting of two areas of petroglyphs located on flat slick rock.

Rock #1

Figure1 appears to be the” feathered serpent”.

Figure 2 appears to be an spirit being (3 fingers and no legs) with his arms pointing down and then up. He is connected to another anthro, Figure 3, who has a head dress with two horns.

Near these figures are clans symbols for the road runner clan and the turkey clan, Figure 4.

Rock #2

Rock #2 is essentially a “newspaper rock” with many symbols intermixed, Figures 7 and 8.

The only dominant symbols are some very large “turkey tracks” seen near the bottom of Figure 8.

The Blue Man

The blue man pictograph Figures 9 and 10, is located below rocks 1 and 2 in a small slot. He is difficult to see from above. It is thought that this glyph is recent within the last few
