## **Region V Report**

#### What's New in Region V?

Region V has an amazing group of very dedicated, talented, and giving ASCLS members. Whenever there is a challenge or a need, ASCLS members step up to "make it happen".

Continuing Education: Region V has a long standing history of providing top-notch state meetings as well as the bi-annual Tri-State meeting. 5 years ago the Region V President's Council appointed a task force to evaluate the Tri-State meeting and to determine how to revamp it for the future. From that discussion the annual Region V Symposium was born. With the 2004 laboratory certification change requiring on-going continuing education, the task force felt it was important to look to providing more opportunities for continuing education. It was further determined that creating an annual meeting to be held the same time each fall would complement the Spring meetings held in the states. From the success of the first Region V Symposium held in Rochester, MN came the idea to create a "Destination" meeting where the Symposium can be held in the same location every year. Many Region V members have helped develop and implement the vision with our first 2 meetings, but a lot of credit goes to Lezlee Koch, who was instrumental in creating the vision, the theme, and the structure, as well as the tools that make it easy for committee members to follow each year. The 2012 Region V Symposium will be held in Alexandria, MN at the Arrowwood Resort and Conference Center. This move will provide an opportunity to hold our meeting in a more resort-like setting. The Arrowwood offers a fantastic indoor water park, spa facilities, 18-hole golf course, mini-golf, horse-back riding, or opportunities to sit around a campfire or simply relax in their lounge. Come for the meeting, stay for the fun (Social Networking!)

Leadership Development: Several years ago, ASCLS created a Leadership Academy with the goal of providing an opportunity for ASCLS members to receive training that would help develop them into future leaders. The leadership Academy encompasses a full year of education and activities that include 3 face-to-face meetings supplemented with monthly conference calls. This is a great opportunity for ASCLS members; however the limited number of "slots" open to a large pool of applicants from across the country reduces the opportunity for Region V members to participate. There is also the cost factor of financially supporting attendees to attend the face-to-face meetings at the national venues. Seeing the challenge and opportunity, a group of Region V members have come together to create a Leadership Academy concept that would be available to Region V members and held within Region V. This will increase the "opportunity" as well as provide a more cost-effective solution. A special thanks to previous Leadership Academy graduates Shannon Jongeward, Jessica Peters, and Charlotte Romain for helping guide the development of this program. Additional thanks to JoAnn Nickles, Jean Bauer, Lezlee Koch, Dawn Michelson, Tracy Roth, Susan Lopez, Alice Hawley, Lori Hemish, and Jeanette Putnam.

Legislative Visibility: One of the greatest challenges in today's legislative arena is trying to get your voice heard in amongst all the other voices and craziness that has become our national politics. ASCLS has been at the forefront of laboratory organizations within the legislative arena. The ASCLS Legislative Symposium creates an opportunity for laboratorians to visit the Washington, DC offices of their congressional representatives. Region V has an amazing number of attendees at this event every year including many students who get an opportunity to see and learn about the legislative process first hand. Region V is also active in their individual states local governance. Licensure efforts were successful in North Dakota many years ago, while Minnesota, South Dakota, and Wisconsin continue their efforts. 
