


A YEAR IN TRANSITION





In 2019, Circle F was in trouble - on the verge of being forced to declare bankruptcy. Using the last of Circle Fs "emergency fund," we were able to repay outstanding debt of approximately \$8,100, but with all our reserves used up, our Treasurer went to work searching out, applying for, and securing grants and donations. It was through the sheer determination of the board that Circle F survived, but the labour paid off with the repair and revitalization of numerous relationships with other equine and animal rescues, donors, and philanthropic organizations. The most important development - one which made the difference in our society being able to carry on - was decision of our Treasurer to apply for a Gaming Grant from the Province of British Columbia. Thanks to Celina Battye's hard work. Circle F was successful in its gaming grant application for the first time in several years. This was a huge win for Circle F and allowed the Board to suspend the looming closure of the rescue. Thanks to the help of a few unwavering members, donors, and Board Members, Circle F stayed afloat until the good news of the successful gaming grant was received in late November. There were many tear-filled eyes, sighs of relief, and congratulations as all who had worked so hard to ensure Circle F would not be forced to close its doors celebrated the good news.
