S.3447 "Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Improvements Act of 2010"





Public Law 111-377

On January 4, 2011,
 President Obama signed into law the "Post-9/11
 Educational Assistance
 Improvements Act of 2010"

ost-9/11 Educational Assistance Improvements Act of 2010

- Expands eligibility to include certain AGR (Title 32) personnel;
- Nationwide Tuition and Fee rates (simplification);
- Break Pay, no longer payable;
- Monthly payment for Kicker instead of a lump-sum payment;
- BAH for distance learning students;
- Books stipend for active duty;
- NCD, OJT, Apprenticeship, Flight and correspondence courses.



AGR Title 32 U.S.C.

- Expands Chapter 33 eligibility to include certain National Guard Members under title 32 U.S.C.
- Effective August 1, 2009 but not payable until October 1, 2011.
- Limits active duty members pursuing a degree at more than half-time to the eligibility tiers (40%-100%).
- Effective March 5, 2011.



Tuition and Fees

- Pay Public Schools the in-state tuition and fees charges;
- Private and foreign school costs are capped at \$17,500 annually;
- Yellow Ribbon Program still exists for out-of state and costs above the cap;
- Effective August 1, 2011.



Break Pay & Kicker

- Break pay is no longer payable under any VA education benefit program unless under an Executive Order of the President or due to to an emergency, such as a natural disaster or strike;
- Kicker payments on a monthly basis instead of lump sum at the beginning of the term;
- Effective August 1, 2011.



BAH for distance (online) learning

- Housing allowance is now payable to students (other than those on active duty) enrolled solely in distance learning;
- The housing allowance payable is equal to ½ the national average BAH for an E-5 with dependents.
- Effective October 1, 2011.



Active Duty personnel

- Students on active duty to receive books and supplies stipend;
- Effective October 1, 2011.



Licensing and Certification Tests

- Reimbursements for more than one "license or certification" test.
- Reimbursement of fees paid to take national exams used for admission to institutions of higher learning, (e.g. SAT, ACT, GMAT, LSAT)



Voc Rehab subsistence

 Allows those who are eligible for both Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment (Chapter 31) benefits and Post-9/11 GI Bill (Chapter 33) benefits to choose the Post-9/11 GI Bill's monthly housing allowance instead of the Chapter 31 subsistence allowance.



Non-college degree (NCD) programs

- Pays actual net cost for in-State tuition and fees at public institutions;
- \$17,500 capped per year for Private institutions;
- Books and supplies stipend at \$83.00 per month.



On-the job (OJT) & Apprenticeship training

- Pays a monthly benefit amount prorated based on time in program;
- \$83.00 per month for books and supplies



Flight programs

 Pays the actual net costs for instate tuition and fees assessed by the school or \$10,000 whichever is less;



Correspondence courses

 Per academic year, pays the actual net costs for in-state tuition and fees assessed by the school or \$8,500 whichever is less.
