Fred Shoop, Mount Joy, PA has donated a wonderful reproduction of the Haldeman Mansion to the Society. It is replete with real limestone exterior walls, brick porch and chimneys, shake shingle roofing, workable doors and interior lighting. Constructed from 1/2 inch plywood, the sturdy reproduction is a marvel to view, to contemplate.

The only thing more remarkable than the model is Fred's largess in donating it to the Society. In his spare time, over about 12 months, he labored in his small, well equipped workshop producing the master piece. When asked how he was able to relinquish custody of the treasure, he replied, "I have achieved my goal, I built it, I over came the challenges of doing so."

Fred grew up in Conoy Township, about one mile north of Bainbridge, on the

former Shoop Farm, along Route 441. Constructing model buildings is one of his hobbies. His completions include models of the Hans Herr House, a covered bridge and the bank barn on the farm where he was raised.

The Society will be forever grateful for Fred's gift. An official unveiling of the Haldeman Mansion model will take place at the Society's Strawberry Festival Jun 7, 2015.

2015 HMPS President's Report

I have been on the HMPS Board since 1999, the year I retired from teaching. And I have served as president for nine years. I still have passion for this old building that has become a full time volunteer job for me.

We continue to hold the regular events every summer starting with the Strawberry Festival. We had our biggest turnout in 2014 with long lines waiting to get the usual lunch and strawberry desserts. We hope for a return of the same friendly guests and volunteers and the David Cronce Band to make this a successful event.

The Victorian Tea was a smash with 39 attending. It is again on for this July 18 at 4 Pm with a high tea. The tavern Dinner followed in September with a full course meal enjoyed by 23 guests. The usual Apple Fall Festival followed in October with "Sweet November" led by Josh Tindall was also a great event. They will also return October 11 with the same band. The Kristkindle Mart also had many local venders and it was a great day to shop early for Christmas. Again the Arts and Craft Show will return to the Bainbridge Fire Hall. All of these events helped raise money for the roof fund and regular expenses.

Lora Shirey was in charge of the paranormal events and visits made to do investigations at the mansion. The first Annual Conference was held in October. 200 visitors attended the lectures and some stayed for a nighttime investigation. This event will return the first weekend in October. We raised money from these paranormal events. Some of this went to the roof fund.

We participated in the Roof Give Away sponsored by Gooding Group Foundation and were awarded another check of \$2,500 for the roof fund. This is the third check we received from them.

We also participated in The Extra Ordinary Give Day done by The Lancaster County Foundation. Our total raised went to the roof fund. We raised \$2,815.33. With all the donations designated from members, the silent auctions, the Great Roof Give Away, the Extra Ordinary Give, the Tea, the Tavern Dinner, the Paranormal Conference, and Kristkindtle Mart, our roof fund is now over \$40,000. At the end of 2013 we had \$26,963.15 in the roof fund. Thank all of you for your donations and volunteer time to help us. We still need about \$25,000 to complete the job. If this is not raised, we will look at getting a grant or loan to do the project this year.

Our goals for this year are several. First we plan to have the painting of the Haldeman Mansion's windows on the second story and trim, soffits, the front porch, including the trim, ceiling, posts plus caulking scraping and any repairs. The second floor of the Carriage house will also get new paint and all the holes patched and repaired. Bids have already been received.



We have a volunteer who will put up spouting on the carriage house.

Another goal is a swell behind the summer house to help with drainage of water that is doing damage to the summer house. This is to be done by the township.

The roof of the mansion is another goal for 2015. Not all details are worked out here. And we are looking to get some more bids as soon as we decide the kind of roof we want.

Several more goals are also in place:

- We are working with a geologist on a project of history and geology. A report containing information on the history & geology of Locust Grove, including charts, maps, and photographs. The report will be placed on the internet and will be sold as a fundraiser. Included in the project will be:

 A written guided tour will be developed from the report for visitors.
 B. The report will be used to develop a PowerPoint Presentation that will be presented by the geologist to the general public or annual meeting
 C. A student educational program will be developed with an abbreviated PowerPoint program for small school groups inside the mansion, an outdoor walking tour and a "History and Geology " scavenger hunt booklet.
 D. A training session will be held for volunteers wanting to assist with the students' program.
- Explore the feasibility of incorporating the Haldeman Mansion property into the Conoy Township's Park System.
 A. A draft proposal is being developed by Dale Good.

B. Form a joint committee to review possible options

- 3. Explore Cooperative Ventures with Lancaster County Historical Society (LCHS).
 - A. Three Areas from a meeting with the Historical Society include:
 - 1. We are working with them to preserve electronically over 200 Haldeman letters donated by Henry and Audrey Haldeman last fall. This will make them available to researchers, the general public and promotions.
 - 2. LCHS is interested in doing an educational program with us that will be tied to the letter collection. A jointly planned program could include an all-day event at the mansion. Dale Good developed a draft vignette based on some of the letters.
 - 3. After we have reviewed the seven boxes of artifacts from donation given to us by Henry & Audrey Haldeman dating back to Samuel Haldeman, the LCHS will assist us with a Curators and Archivists Meeting at the Haldeman Mansion to evaluate our findings.

2014 ExtraGive Donations' Final Report

This year 39 faithful ExtraGive donors from previous years and 15 new donors increased our individual donation total to \$2,815.33. This represents a 16 percent increase over the individual donations received in 2013 and a 3 percent increase over individual donations from the first ExtraGive campaign carried out in 2012. Total number of gifts entered by donors was 62.

This year, unlike 2012, none of our donors were selected at random for the \$1,000 "Golden Tickets". Ten of our donors did make multiple donations hoping to draw a Golden Ticket. Nine donations were made from 12:00AM-3:00AM and nine more from 5:00AM-8:00AM, without any luck!

Those donors associated with supportive business and organizations included: the Executive Director of the Susquehanna Valley Chamber of Commerce and Visitors Center (Columbia, PA), The Art Department Studio (Lancaster, PA), Dark Cellar Productions (Spring Grove, PA), Ghost Detectives (Wilkes Barre, PA), The Ghost Hunter Store (Burlington, NJ), Kenyon Media (Middletown, PA) and the S. Jay Williams Excavating Co. (Bainbridge, PA).

Our total donations received were stretched by \$224.72. These were funds added from the Lancaster County Community Foundations \$326,125 stretch pool, i.e., a pro-rated portion calculated as our total's share of total donations received by all participating organizations. This additional amount more than covered our costs of participation which were limited to a 3.5% fee to cover credit card expenses (\$84.46) and 2.99% to cover the services provided by the Lancaster County Community Foundation's online platform vendor (\$84.18).
