Our July—September Donation Emphasis is the Lutheran World Relief school kits we have supplied in the past.


Our most important needs at this time are notebooks, scissors, crayons, rulers, and pencil sharpeners.

²³ For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, ²⁴ and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. I hope and pray you are all staying safe and healthy this hot and humid summer! Now that some of the pandemic restrictions are slowly being lifted, I hope you are exercising caution in the decisions you're making about going about the activities of daily living. Things like wearing face masks when you're out in public and remembering to stay at least 6 feet apart will go a long way toward keeping us all safer and healthier. I wear mine whenever I go out to a store or anyplace that I might encounter someone I don't know because I love my neighbor and I don't want anything I might have to spread to someone else. Another big thing to remember is to wash your hands before and after any encounter with the outside world. These small things will help us all stay healthy!

Enough about Pandemic precautions, I have really exciting news regarding our worship service. Holy Communion is coming back in August! It will be a little different than what we're used to, but I believe we can celebrate the Holy Sacrament with little to no risk of spreading the Covid-19 virus. First, the Communion elements will be prepared by health care professionals who will wear masks and gloves. All surfaces where the bread wafers and the wine come into contact are sanitized before preparation begins. A Communion wafer is placed into a small condiment cup and set to one side. The Communion wine is poured into a second condiment cup and a lid is securely attached. The condiment cup with the wine is placed on top of the cup with the wafer and one individual communion kit is ready to go, well almost. The latest word from our nursing homes and assisted living facilities for families that want to bring special snacks or other food for their loved ones is that they must drop off the food more than 24 hours before the patient or resident may consume it. That's the rule we're using for the Communion elements as well. The individual Communion kits will be prepared more than 24 hours before we use them on Sunday mornings. That way if there is a virus present it will dissipate before we use it. There are a few pictures attached so you can see what they look like and how they were prepared.

Since the finished Communion Kit resembles the K-Cup used in single serve coffee makers, I call this method Communion by K-Cup. As always, the decision to partake of this Holy Sacrament and how often you partake is between you and God. If you do not feel these precautions are sufficient and wish to hold off until there is a vaccine or a cure, that is your choice and I hope you never feel pressure from me or any of your brothers or sisters in Christ to take Communion when you're not ready or prepared with a repentant heart.

Having said all that, Holy Communion will be offered on the First Sunday each month beginning August 2, 2020. As we did with going back to worshipping together, we're taking this step slowly and cautiously. You all know my feelings about offering Holy Communion often, but we'll be taking this very slowly and only offering Communion once a month until we see what trends are happening with infections and hospitalizations. We certainly don't want to inadvertently cause the spread of the virus to anyone.

I hope this is a bit of good news to you at a time when good news is rare. May God bless our worship time together and may God bless you with continued health and safety. Amen.



A new review published in the Journal of the American Medical Association summarizes current evidence concerning the path-ophysiology, transmission, diagnosis and management of COVID19. Researchers conducted a literature search for studies published from Jan. 1, 2002 to June 15, 2020, using the terms coronavirus, severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2, 2019-nCoV, SARS-CoV-2, SARS-CoV, MERS-CoV

and COVID-19. Based on the review, some of the following observations were made:

- SARS-CoV-2 is spread primarily via respiratory droplets during close face-to-face contact;
- Infection can be spread by asymptomatic, presymptomatic and symptomatic carriers;
- The average time from exposure to symptom onset is five days, and 97.5% of people who develop symptoms do so within 11.5 days;
- The most common symptoms are fever, dry cough and shortness of breath;
- Approximately 5% of patients with COVID-19, and 20% of those hospitalized, experience severe symptoms necessitating intensive care;
- More than 75% of patients hospitalized with COVID-19 require supplemental oxygen;
- The case-fatality rate for COVID-19 varies markedly by age, ranging from 0.3 deaths per 1,000 cases among patients aged five to 17 years to 304.9 deaths per 1,000 cases among patients aged 85 years or older in the US.;
- Among patients hospitalized in the intensive care unit, the case fatality is up to 40%; and
- Until an effective vaccine is available, the primary methods to reduce spread are face masks, social distancing and contact tracing.

Researchers conclude, "As of July 1, 2020, more than 10 million people worldwide had been infected with SARS-CoV-2. Many aspects of transmission, infection, and treatment remain unclear.




